Elected Officials Report:

The Honorable Michael Boylan, District 6, shared the following updates:

• Council President Salem has created a special subcommittee called the JSO Primary Facilities Review Committee. The purpose of this subcommittee is to evaluate the prospect of relocating the Duval County Jail and JSO headquarters. Council Member Boylan will serve as Chair on this special subcommittee. The subcommittee will begin their evaluation process by touring the jail and associated facilities in the upcoming weeks. With additional information, an analysis will be completed to determine the current useful life of the jail, and the most cost-effective way to relocate or redevelop the 30-year-old jail.

- On Tuesday, July 25, 2023, Council Member Boylan will host a meeting with many of his colleagues to review the findings from the Critical Quality of Life Subcommittee.
- On August 1, 2023, at 6:00 pm, Mayor Deegan will host her first Town Hall Meeting at the Mandarin Senior Center. An invitation to attend was extended to everyone. Council Member Boylan will also be in attendance to provide a few remarks and updates at this meeting.
- As an LUZ update, 2023-0005 Livingston Road will be taken up for a vote at the August 1st Land Use & Zoning (LUZ) committee meeting which starts at 5:00 pm in Council Chambers, 117 W Duval Street, 32202.
