WHEREAS: Girl's interest in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM)

fields begins to decline at age 8, with a sharp decrease by age 12; and

WHEREAS: Gender stereotypes, negative stigma, a lack of role models and

representation, and limited exposure all contribute to the

underrepresentation of girls and women in STEM; and

WHEREAS: Exposure to female role models in STEM has been proven to increase

girls' interest and confidence in pursuing STEM subjects; and

WHEREAS: The 2023 Galaxy Festival, hosted by The ScienceSIS, is an event that

connects young girls and girls of color with exciting STEM performances and experiences, hands on experiments, and a variety of

cultural activities; and

WHEREAS: The City of Jacksonville joins the ScienceSIS and partners to celebrate

women in STEM and encourage a future generation of girls to pursue an education and career in science, technology, engineering, and

math.
