IV. Executive Director's Report

Timothy Johnson

a. Share Plan Update

James Holderfield thanked the Committee for attending last month's 3-hour long meeting. He thanked everyone for their dedication and preparation for the hearing.

Timothy Johnson said that the recommendation made by the Advisory Committee last month regarding the disability application will be sent to the Board of Trustees this month. The Board will hold its own hearing. He thanked the Committee for all their work.

Timothy Johnson reminded the Advisory Committee of the Annual Members' Meeting, which will be held on March 20th from 9:00 A.M. to 11:00 A.M. in the Pension Office atrium.

Steve Lundy updated the Advisory Committee on the Share Plan. The Share Plan process was run last month, and the maximum Share Plan account balance now stands at \$5,738.10 for members hired prior to October 1, 2014.

Chuck Hayes said Share Plan statements will be sent out this Friday.

Chuck Hayes updated the Advisory Committee on the reemployed pensioners quarterly report. All new reemployed pensioners have entered jobs approved by the ordinance and are in compliance.

Bob Sugarman said there is good work going on behind the scenes, and there will be a meeting to discuss the complex children's benefit, and pension forfeitures. He said last month's disability hearing went well, and he asked if the Advisory Committee had any comments on things they would like to see improved.

Thomas Lumpkin asked if the Advisory Committee could leave the room and deliberate – like a jury – before rendering its recommendation.

Bob Sugarman said that this cannot be done – sunshine laws prohibit it.

Lawsikia Hodges said the hearing went well. She said she had two suggestions. First, the Advisory Committee should be briefed on the standards for disability hearing prior to the hearing as opposed to at the hearing. Second, the lawyers should leave the table after they make their arguments.
