ONE CITY. ONE JACKSONVILLE.

WHEREAS: Missing persons, regardless of age or circumstances surrounding their disappearance, are not forgotten; and

WHEREAS: Disappearances bring uncertainty and lack of closure that can be extremely painful for families and loved ones; and

WHEREAS: The John Rowan, Jr. Foundation and the Justice Coalition of Jacksonville have partnered again this year to host the 10th annual Missing Adults Day in Jacksonville, in remembrance of the loved ones who have not yet been found and to offer much-needed support to the families of the missing; and

WHEREAS: The John Rowan, Jr. Foundation was founded in honor of John P. Rowan, Jr., a Jacksonville resident, husband and father who was last seen on February 23, 2001; and

WHEREAS: The Justice Coalition provides services and support to victims of violent crimes, educates the community about criminal justice offerings and works to be a proactive force in the fight against crime; and

WHEREAS: Missing Adults Day reminds communities to remain vigilant in the continued search for Jacksonville's missing, and offers support for those families whose missing loved ones are not forgotten.


