WHEREAS: Immigrants and descendants of immigrants can be found in

every sector of American life, growing businesses and the economy, innovating and sharing creativity, fighting for our

freedoms and more; and

WHEREAS: For people forced to flee their home countries under threat of

persecution, conflict and/or violence, the United States has also served as a refuge. On December 4, 2000, the United Nations General Assembly passed a resolution designating June 20 as World Refugee Day, honoring the courage and

determination of those forced from their homes; and

WHEREAS: Jacksonville is home to many immigrants who influence our

social, cultural and economic atmosphere, fundamentally enriching the extraordinary character of our city, state and nation. Most refugees in our community emigrated from Cuba, Haiti, Democratic Republic of Congo, Iraq and Burma;

and

WHEREAS: For their countless and varied contributions, immigrants are

celebrated in the city of Jacksonville.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim June 20, 2022 as

WORLD REFUGEE DAY

in Jacksonville and encourage all citizens to join me in recognizing the contributions of immigrants in our city and the bravery of refugees who now call our community home.
