facing financial insecurity, hunger, and even homelessness; and

WHEREAS: The City of Jacksonville is proud of the service of veterans in the

community. The Military Affairs and Veterans Department (MAVD) works closely with community, state, and nonprofit partners to provide housing, job, and other supports to the veteran population in

Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS: Feed the People Jax is a non-profit organization that provides meals

to homeless and hungry veterans and others in need throughout the

community; and

WHEREAS: Every other month, Feed the People Jax hosts events that provide

hundreds of meals to homeless veterans and others in the

community; and

WHEREAS: Jacksonville is proud of its veteran community, and of the service

organizations that have stepped up to support veterans and those in

need as they reintegrate into civilian life.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim September 24, 2022 as

FEED THE PEOPLE DAY

in Jacksonville and encourage all citizens to raise awareness of the challenges facing veterans in the community and the organizations stepping up to meet these challenges.
