Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, is to "promote a philosophy of independent living including a philosophy of consumer control, peer support, self-help, self-determination, equal access, and individual and system advocacy, in order to maximize the leadership, empowerment, independence, and productivity of individuals with disabilities, and the integration and full inclusion of individuals with disabilities into the

mainstream of American society."; and

WHEREAS: Centers for Independent Living (CIL) are designed and operated by

individuals with disabilities and provide independent living services for

people with disabilities; and

WHEREAS: Centers for Independent Living support community living and independence

for people with disabilities across the nation based on the belief that all people can live with dignity, make their own choices, and participate fully in

society; and

WHEREAS: Centers for Independent Living provide tools, resources, and supports for

integrating people with disabilities fully into their communities to promote

equal opportunities, self-determination, and respect; and

WHEREAS: Florida's Independent Living Council, Association of Centers for Independent

Living, Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, and each Center for Independent Living from across our great State has gathered in Jacksonville, Florida to forge a future of independence for Floridians with Disabilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim October 24, 2022 as
