

WHEREAS: The Bolles School varsity girls soccer team capped off a 21-win season

with a shutout victory against West Palm Beach Oxbridge Academy in

the class 2A state championship on February 21; and

WHEREAS: In the championship, the Bulldogs scored four unanswered goals: one

by sophomore midfielder Avery Patterson, two by senior midfielder Ariana Munoz, and one by senior defender Aunikah King. Sophomore striker Olivia Candelino – the Bulldogs' season leader in goals, assists and shots – notched a few more assists and attempts. The Bulldogs

made 23 shots on the goal to the ThunderWolves' 10; and
