are our sons and daughters, our mothers and fathers, our brothers and sisters, and all are deserving of our love, compassion, and

support; and

WHEREAS: The Jacksonville community resolves to work together to ensure all

citizens can receive the quality mental health and substance use treatment they need to succeed and live a productive and healthy life;

and

WHEREAS: Local law enforcement, first responders, mental health providers,

doctors, nurses, and other professionals across the city who tirelessly work to protect our communities are pivotal in Jacksonville's fight

against the overdose epidemic; and

WHEREAS: Statewide and locally, ISaveFL.com is a resource for residents to

search for providers in our community who offer free naloxone, a medication that can temporarily restore the breathing of someone experiencing an opioid overdose while waiting for emergency medical

services.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, DONNA DEEGAN, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim August 31, 2023 as

OVERDOSE AWARENESS DAY

in Jacksonville and encourage all citizens to recognize the importance of loved ones lost to an overdose and to raise awareness regarding substance use and help prevent future overdoses in our community.
