

WHEREAS: The women veterans population is one of the fastest-growing segments

among United States veterans. Of the approximately 21.3 million living veterans nationwide, more than 2 million are women. The state of Florida has the nation's third-largest population of women veterans, the majority

of whom reside in Duval County; and

WHEREAS: Women veterans have served our country with dedication, honor and

bravery, and like their male counterparts, they may face challenges such as post-traumatic stress disorder, sexual trauma, high divorce rate, health issues and even homelessness. Women may also face unique challenges

involving gender discrimination or child care needs; and

WHEREAS: Several agencies support the specific needs of women veterans, including

The Center for Women Veterans, established by Congress in 1994, and the Northeast Florida Women Veterans Association, Inc., whose local mission is to ensure that women veterans have the tools needed to

successfully transition back to civilian life; and

WHEREAS: The observance of Women's History Month can trace its roots further

back than 1987 when Congress declared to observe it each March. In alignment with Women's History Month, the state of Florida initiated a Women Veterans Recognition Week, now in its fifth year, to be held

during the third week of March; and

WHEREAS: The City of Jacksonville joins the national community in honoring the

invaluable impact women veterans make, both locally and throughout the world, during the annual observance of Women Veterans Recognition

Week.
