

WHEREAS: The great civil rights movement activist Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was born

January 15, 1929, in Atlanta, Georgia; and

WHEREAS: Dr. King rose to national prominence as leader of the Montgomery

Improvement Association (MIA) in 1955 when the organization arranged a boycott of Montgomery's bus service following Rosa Parks' refusal to vacate her seat for a white passenger. His leadership role grew when he became the first president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC); and

WHEREAS: Dr. King's advocacy for nonviolence and civil disobedience shaped the

trajectory of the civil rights movement and brought about many successes in securing the rights of African-Americans nationwide; unfortunately, he was

unable to see his vision through to fruition due to his death in 1968; and

WHEREAS: Plans to commemorate Dr. King's birthday began in the months after his

death. His widow, Coretta Scott King, would continue to advocate for the creation of a federal holiday until an official observance, on the third Monday in January, was signed into law by President Ronald Reagan in 1983; and

WHEREAS: As a result of the continued advocacy of Mrs. King, President Bill Clinton

signed the Martin Luther King, Jr. Federal Holiday and Service Act in 1994, expanding the mission of the holiday as a day of community service,

interracial cooperation and youth anti-violence initiatives; and

WHEREAS: On what would be Dr. King's 90th birthday, the City of Jacksonville joins our

nation in remembering his leadership's indelible impact on generations of

Americans of every race, creed and background.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby commemorate

on January 15, 2019, and encourage all Jacksonville citizens to join me in honoring Dr. King's legacy and furthering his vision through efforts in service to our community.
