

WHEREAS: According to the U.S. Census Bureau, there are more than 460,000

women in Jacksonville, representing 51.5 percent of the total

population; and

WHEREAS: Pay equity is critical to the economic security of many families, with

nearly 4 in 10 mothers serving as the primary income-earners for their

households; and

WHEREAS: According to statistics collected by the American Association of

University Women, Florida women working full time in 2017 earned 87

percent of what men earned, and 86 percent in Duval County; and

WHEREAS: Each April, Equal Pay Day is recognized nationally to raise awareness of

gender wage disparities. The annual date varies to symbolize the number of days into the year that American women must work to earn what American men earned in the previous year; this year's observance

is April 2; and

WHEREAS: The City of Jacksonville supports increasing awareness of the needs of

the female workforce, by collaborating with institutions that introduce girls to diverse career paths and encourage STEM-based learning opportunities. The Mayor's Commission on the Status of Women is among many organizations that promote the well-being of women throughout the community, recognizing that this in turn contributes to

the well-being of Jacksonville's families.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim April 2, 2019 as

EQUAL PAY DAY

in Jacksonville and encourage all citizens to celebrate women in the workforce, acknowledge gender wage disparities and participate in efforts that contribute to its elimination.
