WHEREAS: Ehlers-Danlos syndromes (EDS) are a group of 13 heritable connective

tissue disorders that together affect 1 in 5,000 people; and

WHEREAS: Each type of EDS and Hypermobility Spectrum Disorder (HSD) has its

own set of symptoms, but some features are seen across all types of EDS, including joint hypermobility, skin hyperextensibility, and tissue

fragility; and

WHEREAS: There is no cure for any type of EDS or HSD. The conditions are

managed by addressing an individual's symptoms, often requiring

multiple specialists and care providers; and

WHEREAS: Access to professionals who are knowledgeable about EDS and HSD is

limited in Jacksonville. Lack of awareness about EDS and HSD can bar access to diagnosis, pain and symptom management and future

research of these conditions; and

WHEREAS: Increasing awareness of EDS and HSD in the community can improve

the lives and outcomes of individuals living with EDS and HSD; and

WHEREAS: The Ehlers-Danlos Support Group of Jacksonville was founded in 2018

to support individuals and families affected by EDS and HSD. The Mayo Clinic of Jacksonville also raises awareness through their special clinic opened in 2020, which treats individuals from all over the

country who live with these conditions.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby recognize May 2023 as the
