

Construction Begins on the Southbank Riverwalk




Construction has

Mayor Appoints New Education Commissioner



Dr. Annmarie Kent-Willette, an award-winning educator and communications expert, will serve as Jacksonville's education commissioner, Mayor Alvin Brown announced in a news conference at Jacksonville University on Sept. 3. Dr. Kent-Willette will serve onloan from Jacksonville University for a term of two years.

Dr. Kent-Willette has been widely honored for her work in education, most recently as a three-time First Coast Scholar, where she was selected to teach seminars to K-12 teachers and academic coaches at the Schultz Center for Teaching and Leadership in Duval County. The City of Jacksonville's Building Inspection Division (BID), which is part of the city's Planning Department, has become one of the nation's select few building departments to earn accreditation from the International Accreditation Service (IAS), a subsidiary of the International Code Council (ICC).

This distinguished accreditation credential means that BID underwent two rigorous onsite evaluations by an independent and internationally recognized accreditation body, and successfully met all accreditation requirements. An IAS team of subject matter

Visit from U.S. Health & Human Services Secretary




U.S. Health and Human Services Secretary
