

### Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 4:05 p.m. by Chair Ellen Schmitt.

### **Moment of Silence**

Chair Schmitt asked for a moment of silence to be observed for individuals who have died of HIV/AIDS, or those living with and affected by the disease, and for everyone experiencing other emotional, psychological, and physical issues.

### Mission Statement

Chair Schmitt read the mission statement to the group.

"The mission of the Planning Council is to provide a means for planning and implementing a coordinated response to the needs of people living with and affected by HIV disease."

### Roll Call

Secretary Pat Sampson took the roll. There were no proxy pool members present; a quorum was declared.

### **Public Comments**

Mark Cleveland addressed the Council under public comments. Mark expressed concern
over the fact that PLWHA consumers are having a hard time reaching the Jacksonville Area
Legal Aid by phone. He stated that many times the main phone line is not answered, and
when it is, it doesn't seem like the messages are getting through to the JALA staff who
handle Ryan White clients.

Council Member Heather Kilpatrick answered Mark's concern later in the meeting. She stated that Ryan White clients should continue calling the main number of 356-8371, and when prompted for an extension, to dial either 310, 312, or 360. These extensions are for the three JALA staffers who handle Ryan White clients. Heather said this step should take care of the problem.

### **Approval of Minutes**

A motion was made and seconded to accept the January 23, 2014 Minutes as presented. The motion was carried.

### **Administrative Agency Report**

Acting Division Chief Johnnetta Moore presented the Agency Report in Deidre Kelley's absence. We have received a partial award and contracts will be in the mail to our service providers next week. The partial payment will fund approximately three months of services. HRSA has scheduled a national conference call for March 12 where we hope to find out more about when the remainder of our funding award will arrive.

Implementation of the Affordable Care Act, also known as Obama Care, has been problematic. While HRSA has instructed all Ryan White grantees to vigorously enroll eligible clients into qualified health plans, the State of Florida Department of Health has been slow to respond. Florida Part A representatives met with State Department of Health staff last week in Tallahassee to discuss ways we could work together to ensure that no PLWHA would go without services. This planning is expected to continue for the next several months. In the meantime, the health insurance premium assistance program recently approved by this Planning Council will be implemented and all Part A funded service providers will be instructed to continue to encourage their clients to enroll in a qualified health insurance plan.

A number of Planning Council members attended the February 17 public hearing regarding proposed changes to Florida Administrative Rule 64. There will be more information forthcoming regarding Rule 64 and the impact it will have on our programs.

The Patient Care Planning Group (PCPG) meeting is coming up the first week in April. If you have any concerns or any issues about HIV care and treatment for PLWHA's in Florida, then please let your Planning Council representatives know, so they can address them in Tampa.

### **Committee Reports**

The committee met on February 6 and continues to plan for several upcoming events, including the March 10 Women & Girls HIV Awareness Day. Council members were encouraged to read through the minutes and volunteer for one of these events.

PLWHAA Nathaniel Hendley

The committee was off to a running start; members changed the PLWHAA Purpose Statement and started an ad hoc committee for the CONNECTIONS Conference.

Nominating Justin Bell

During their February 7 meeting, Dr. Dana Barnes was interviewed for the mandated category of Formerly Incarcerated Representative. The committee is recommending Dr. Barnes for this category, replacing Tammy Morris who is not seeking reappointment.

Mark Cleveland moved and Sharon Peterson seconded a motion to submit the name of Dr. Dana Barnes for recommendation to Mayor Brown as an appointee to the Jacksonville Planning Council. Motion was approved.

Justin went over the form that the Nominating Committee used to review candidates seeking reappointment. There was discussion with questions and answers from the Council Members regarding what the Nominating Committee looked at, and if any particular area, such as attendance or community involvement, received more attention than the other areas. The Council wants to look at this process again, and see if a Procedure should be developed, so everyone knows what will be expected of them when applying for reappointment. Council Member Frank Emanuel went on record saying he opposes this evaluation process, as he feels it is not fair or objective.

The committee met and reviewed several items that had been referred to them.

Motion made by Heather Kilpatrick, seconded by Justin Bell, to adopt Policies & Procedures 2013-01, which will allow all members to have designated proxies, if they so choose. After a brief discussion, the motion was voted on and approved.

Motion made by Heather Kilpatrick, seconded by Justin Bell, to amend Policies & Procedures 2006-01, Item 2, Bylaws Committee, changing the composition of the membership to include the members of the Executive Committee. Discussion followed and Bylaws Committee clarified that their committee would remain separate from the Executive Committee; they are just seeking to have all Executive Committee members designated as also being members of the Bylaws Committee, along with any other Planning Council member who wishes to join Bylaws. This motion was then voted on and approved.

Co-Chair Pat Sampson outlined the request to have the EIIHA Committee added as a standing committee of the Planning Council. This will affect Bylaws Article X, Section 3, item I, and also Policies & Procedures No. 2006-01, Item 9. This is the first reading of the proposed Bylaws change. The second reading and vote will be during the next Planning Council meeting.







### Policies for Committee Membership and Voting

The Metropolitan Jacksonville Area HIV Health Services Planning Council has eight (8) committees charged with responsibility for developing policies and procedures as legislated in the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Extension Act of 2009. Those committees are as follows (Article X, Section 3, Planning Council Bylaws, Last Amended October 24, 2013):

- 1. **Executive** Ensures orderly and integrated progression of the Planning Council committee work, plans future activities, and approves the Planning Council budget when it is impractical to convene the full Planning Council.
- 2. **Bylaws** Reviews and updates the bylaws as necessary and at least annually. This committee shall be composed of Executive Committee members and other interested Planning Council members. The committee will meet at least twice a year to review the bylaws, updating as necessary, and Bylaws Committee meetings will be held in conjunction with an Executive Committee meeting.
- 3. **Priority and Allocations** Establishes service priorities and allocates funds to Ryan White eligible service categories. Regularly and effectively assesses the efficiency of the Administrative Agency in rapidly allocating/reallocating funds and provides input to the Planning Council as a whole.
- 4. **Continuum of Care Coordinate** Serves to coordinate the planning of Part A and Part B services in the TGA and Area 4. There are three (3) subcommittees:
  - (a) **Eligibility** Reviews and makes recommendations regarding eligibility for Ryan White services in Area 4 (Baker, Clay, Duval, Nassau, and St. Johns Counties).
  - (b) **Needs Assessment** Identifies needs and barriers to care for individuals affected by HIV disease.
  - (c) **Comprehensive Planning** Oversees the development and implementation of a Comprehensive Plan for Area 4.
- 5. **Pharmacy & Therapeutics** Reviews and recommends changes to the Ryan White Formulary and processes for dispensing pharmaceuticals.

- 6. **Nominating** Recommends candidates for vacancies on the Planning Council as outlined in the open nominations operating procedures. Provides nominations for officers of the Planning Council.
- 7. **PLWHAA** (People Living With HIV/AIDS and Affected Community) acts as a platform within the affected and infected community for the development of treatments and a cure, supports individuals to make informed choices about their HIV health, advocates for quality health care to respond to HIV and related conditions, and promotes medical strategies that prevent new infections.
- 8. **Women, Adolescents, and Children** Develops recommendations to address the issues of women, adolescents, children and family centered care.
- 9. **EIIHA** (Early Identification of Individuals with HIV/AIDS) focuses on facilitating rapid case identification and barrier-free linkage to ambulatory HIV/AIDS care for individuals living in Region 4. This committee looks at providing tools that can assist in the identification of persons who do not know their HIV status or who are out of care and provide the means to link them to health and support services.

### Committee Membership - Planning Council

The Chair and Vice Chair of the Planning Council will appoint the Co-Chairs of each of the committees upon recommendations of the committees. Nomination for committee Co-Chairs will be made in October at regularly scheduled committee meetings. Appointment of committee Co-Chairs by the Planning Council Chair and Vice Chair will occur in January. Committee Co-Chairs will be limited to two terms of one year each per committee. Upon the approval of the committee Co-Chairs, persons who are not members of the Planning Council may be included as members of committees in accordance with the pre-orientation policy (Article X, Section 1, Planning Council Bylaws, Amended 2008).

Any member of the Planning Council can be a member of any Planning Council committee or subcommittee. Members of the public can make a written request for of the Co-Chairs from the membership committee/subcommittee committee/subcommittee the person is interested in joining. Upon approval by the the member of public becomes a of the member the Co-Chairs, committee/subcommittee.



- Section 2 All Committee meetings will be open to the public.
- Section 3 Planning Council committees will include:
  - A. Executive Committee ensures orderly and integrated progression of the Planning Council committee work, plans future activities, and approves the Planning Council budget when it is impractical to convene the full Planning Council.
  - B. Bylaws Committee reviews and updates the bylaws as necessary and at least annually.
  - C. Priority and Allocations establishes service priorities and allocates/reallocates funds to service categories.
  - D. Continuum of Care Coordination Committee serves as a communication link to the three (3) subcommittees described below:

Eligibility - reviews and makes recommendations regarding eligibility for Ryan White services in Area 4 (Baker, Clay, Duval, Nassau and St. Johns Counties);

Needs Assessment - identifies needs and barriers to care for individuals affected by HIV disease;

Comprehensive Planning - oversees the development and implementation of a Comprehensive Plan for Jacksonville Transitional Grant Area 4.

- E. Pharmacy & Therapeutics reviews and recommends changes to the Ryan White Formulary and processes for dispensing pharmaceuticals.
- F. Nominating Committee recommends candidates for vacancies on the Planning Council as outlined in the open nominations operating procedures and recommends nominations for officers of the Planning Council.
- G. Women, Adolescents, and Children with HIV- develops recommendations to address the needs of women, adolescents, children and family centered care.
- H. PLWHAA Committee acts as a platform within the affected and infected community for the development of treatments and a cure, supports individuals to make informed choices about their HIV health, advocates for quality health care to respond to HIV and related conditions, and promotes medical strategies that prevent new infections.
- I. **EIIHA** (Early Identification of Individuals with HIV/AIDS) focuses on facilitating rapid case identification and barrier-free linkage to ambulatory HIV/AIDS care for individuals living in Region 4. This committee looks at providing tools that can assist in the identification of persons who do not know their HIV status or who are out of care and provide the means to link them to health and support services.

### **Procedure for Designated Proxy Pool**

Designated Proxy: An individual who is not affiliated with the Planning Council

or any of its committees.

Proxy Pool: An individual who is part of the Planning Council family, and

who was voted into the position by the full Planning Council,

and who abides by the rules of the Council

All members of the Metropolitan Jacksonville Area HIV Health Services Planning Council, regardless of their mandated category, will be eligible to have their own designated proxy.

A Planning Council member should complete and sign a Notice of Proxy form, designating their proxy, and submit to the Planning Council Secretary for processing. Notice of Proxy forms are not considered activated until they are accepted and signed by the current Planning Council Secretary. After the form is signed by the Council Secretary, the Council Secretary or the Program Support Aide will advise the Planning Council member.

The following requirements will be in place for selecting your own Designated Proxy:

- · Must be 18 years of age or older
- Cannot be a Jacksonville Planning Council member, a Proxy Pool member, or a member of any Planning Council committee

There will be an opt-out provision, where the Council Member can have someone from the Proxy Pool fill in during their absence. Proxy Pool members could sit in for any Council member, regardless of their mandated category, and would not be specifically assigned to any one member. Both Council and Proxy Pool members would still abide by the Sunshine Law.

### **POLICIES and PROCEDURES**

No. 2013-01 Issued:

Notice of Proxy forms will be submitted to the Council Secretary within 30 days of the new Council Member being voted on by the Planning Council for recommendation to the Mayor. The Notice of Proxy form will be in effect until the Council member's term ends. Upon reappointment, the Planning Council member will complete and sign a new form to submit to the Planning Council Secretary within 30 days.

The following guidelines should also be noted:

- HIV status is not identified for a Designated Proxy. Members are free to choose their own proxies without regard to the Designated Proxy's HIV status.
- Planning Council members <u>cannot</u> discuss Council business with a Proxy Pool member, but they can discuss business with their Designated Proxy. This allows the Council member to advise their designated proxy on how to vote in the member's absence.
- Should a Designated Proxy join a Planning Council committee, their Designated Proxy status would then be voided and the Program Support Aide would notify the Council Member to select another Designated Proxy.
- If the Planning Council member uses a Designated Proxy and both their primary and alternate proxies are absent from a meeting, the Council will not select another person to fill in. Likewise, if a Planning Council member uses the Proxy Pool, and the number of members absent exceed the number of available Proxy Pool members, then that Council member will not have representation at the meeting.
- Designated proxies are not eligible to have their taxi service paid by Ryan White, but Proxy Pool members will continue to have this benefit.
- Council packets are not mailed to designated proxies. It is the Council member's responsibility to provide their designated proxy with Planning Council information.

### **POLICIES and PROCEDURES**

No. 2013-01 Issued:

- The Designated Proxy's vote is final. The Planning Council member will have no recourse in voiding a vote that was cast in their name.
- There are no training or membership requirements to be met for designated proxies, other than the proxy being at least 18 years of age. Members are encouraged to consider selecting individuals who would be congenial and respectful to the other Planning Council members and guests. Membership requirements for Proxy Pool members remain in force, namely Proxy Pool members must go through the interview process, be voted in by the Planning Council, participate on at least one committee, and have their attendance tracked.
