KEEP JACKSONVILLE BEAUTIFUL HONORS FOUNDER MAYOR JAKE GODBOLD

First ever Jake Award recognizes vision for a cleaner community

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., February 5, 2010 – Former Mayor Jake Godbold was honored with the first ever Jake Award by the Keep Jacksonville Beautiful Commission (KJB) on January 22, 2010. The Award recognizes Mayor Godbold for creating the KJB in 1983; a local affiliate of Keep America Beautiful. The KJB has a 27 year history of organizing clean-up events and advocating for a more beautiful community. When accepting the award, the former Mayor was adamant that a clean city makes for a more economically viable city.

Two hundred members of the community celebrated the 27th Anniversary of the Keep Jacksonville Beautiful Commission with Mayor Godbold. Event sponsors Paper Retriever Recycling, APAC-Florida, Inc., Bank of America, HUBBARD, JB Coxwell Contracting, Inc., Republic, and Waste Management were all on hand to extend their congratulations to the former Mayor for his efforts to make Jacksonville a cleaner and greener city.

In addition to honoring Mayor Godbold, Keep Jacksonville Beautiful also recognized its volunteers for their efforts to clean-up and beautify Jacksonville during 2009. Last year more than 10,000 volunteers participated in KJB sponsored events throughout the community.
