Call to Order

Chairperson Williams called the meeting to order at 5:02 p.m. in the Main Library in Conference

Room G-4 with a moment of silence and welcomed everyone.

#### Approval of the Minutes

Member Dr. Norman made a made a Motion to accept the minutes from the February 4, 2008 meeting. A second was made by Member Johnson-McPherson. The Vote: All in favor; none opposed.

#### **Guest Speaker**

City of Jacksonville Ethics Attorney Carla Miller gave a PowerPoint presentation on Ethics Training. She went over the following:

- Sunshine Law means that CPAC members can not leave a room and talk about business after the meeting. Members can not do anything in secret, can't send e-mails or call each other to discuss the CPAC business.
- Public Records the Housing and Neighborhoods Staff prepare the written records which are the public record. They are open to the public and anyone can see the documents.
- Voting Conflict if you vote on something and a say a brother-in-law or someone will benefit you have a conflict. If you are not certain get a legal opinion.
- Ethics Laws there are three kinds of ethics values, technical laws and criminal prosecution.
- The purpose of CPAC is to promote communication with city government and the
  residents it serves. On a scale of 1 to 5 (5 being the best that the city listened to the
  residents) how well is the city doing The average was approximately 1.5 which
  means the city has to work harder to communicate with the residents.
- These are the things that the city is working on:
  - o Hired Ethics Attorney Miller who had helped write the Ethics Code in 1999.
  - Ethics Officer Miller is available to work on problems and is doing city-wide ethics training.
  - o Has an Inspector General, Pam Markham, that does city audits.
  - o Started a hotline for the ethics concerns at 630-1015. Calls are coming in and it's confidential and they can't be traced also can e-mail at <a href="Ethics@coi.net">Ethics@coi.net</a>
  - o There are now internal controls for Procurement.
  - o There is a 9 member Ethics Commission to get citizen input.
  - o The Grand Jury continues to meet to see if there are violations.
- Members had numerous questions for Attorney Miller. Member Hartman had questions about subcommittees. They need to be noticed, take minutes and do business in the Sunshine.

## **Staff Reports**

Jacksonville Sheriff's Office (JSO) - Sqt Perkins reported on the following:

- Sheriff Rutherford brought back Operation Safe Streets which pays the overtime for 72 off-duty officers in the amount of \$3 million dollars. The officers are deployed in high crime areas to get guns off the streets; it gives the officers on patrol more time to handle calls for service and to have walk and talks in the neighborhoods. Most of the problems are related to drugs. Last year with OSS crime went down 38%.
- The Sheriff is looking to hire 200 more officers since a number of officers are retiring.
- Members wanted to know what they could do to help the police. Continue to educate neighbors and invite them to CPAC and ShAdCo meetings.

### **Guest Speaker**

Environmental Quality Chief Vince Seibold presented a PowerPoint on the 2008-028 Ordinance that will regulate fertilizers and landscape irrigation. The regulation will get the excess nutrients that are going into the river from Stormwater runoffs. He talked about the cities cost for picking up grass clippings. If residents mulched their grass and left the clippings on the lawn it would save approximately \$627,000. The Fertilizer Ordinance and Landscape Irrigation 2008-030 is being deferred to go out to the community first. If you plant the "right plant in the right place" this will help the environment by managing pests, reducing runoff and using less water. Members had numerous questions.

- Member Vanderlaan stated that they had been asking for signs at Hogan's Creek to say "Don't feed the ducks and geese" to help bring the population of ducks and geese under control. The sign had not been installed.
- Member Miller was concerned that the street sweepers may be pushing more waste into the storm drains. EQD will check on this.
