Guest Speaker(s)

Scheduled Speaker – Rex Homlin, Better Jax Plan

Topic: Main Library. Reported that the total project budget is \$95 million dollars, and a local firm is handling construction. The new facility is 74% completed and is 30,000 square feet. Some of the amenities will included over 300 computers and a café and courtyard. A 600-car garage adjacent to the facility is also under construction.

Scheduled Speaker - Sherry Hall, Communications Director, Water & Sewer Expansion Authority

Topic: Water and Septic Tank Fee Structures. Discussed fee schedules for retrofit of sewer lines. Program is voluntary and is being funded with a \$5 million gift from City of Jacksonville. The city will contribute a percentage of the total cost per residential project, on installation of lines, which is incentivized on the front end. The average cost per project is \$5,000 - \$20,000, and is payable over a period of up to 30 years. Jacksonville has some 175 thousand septic tanks and 118 thousand wells.

Scheduled Speaker – Teala Milton, Vice President Government Affairs JEA

Topic: History/Structure of JEA. Reported that Jim Dickinson is current CEO and had the task of implementing the first rate increase in years. Stated that tree canopies were responsible for 99% of power

outages during this hurricane season. Informed members that the cost to install underground power lines is \$1 million per mile.

Floree Johnson-McPherson announced that the Gateway Park located at 8th Street and Boulevard will be renamed to the John N. McPherson Park in February
