John Barnard, P.E. representing Independence Recycling of Florida presented information on the application for a zoning exception E-07-36 on "Construction and demolition recycling facility" at 1200 Wigmore St. This proposal would be for a facility that would crush concrete. The current site is on Tallyrand on 8th Street. It is at capacity. There have been problems with dust at this location. The City Council will have a series of meetings on this before it would get approval for a COM. Members had numerous questions on the following: noise level for surrounding homes, how far will the dust go, what will happen on windy days, will the dust and material get into Willowbranch Creek, will this add to the flooding that currently happens in this area, and what type of health issues could come from this? The Urban Core statistically has the highest level of asthma in the county - how will this affect the air quality and breathing of the surrounding neighbors and workers? Members would like to get the Department of Health and Duval County School Board to provide experts on this. They would also like to know if it is in the Enterprise Zone and how does the EPA fit into this? What recourse do citizens have?
