- 4. Presentations Bus Rapid Transit North Corridor Project by JTA, Suraya Teeple. A PowerPoint presentation showed the BRT bus corridor. BRT is part of the planned regional transportation system. Buses will be branded "Max", with a gold color. Buses will arrive at transit stations every 10-15 minutes. Intersection improvements such as traffic signal priority will be completed to allow buses and emergency vehicles to have green signal priority. Buses will travel in transit lanes. Parking will be available in park and ride lots. The phases are planned in this order: downtown: North phase to Lem Turner; SE because of employment opportunities, East downtown and SW downtown to the Orange Park Mall. Buses will run: First Street, the new VA hospital, UNF Health (Shands), MLK Parkway, Boulevard, Gateway Shopping Center, Rowe's, Soutel Drive, Capper Road and Dunn Avenue. <u>Parks and Recreation</u> – District Manager Shaniqua Simmons reported:

- Woodstock Park playground construction will be completed in December 2013.
- Beverly Hills Park swing updates, football field upgrade and ADA access will be completed in December 2013.
- A concern was expressed about the swing set at Fields Park, which presents a safety issue. It needs immediate repair or replacement.
- A resident expressed appreciation for work completed on the Fields Park walkway.

# Housing and Neighborhoods (HAND) -

- Municipal Code Compliance: Danny Connell:
  - o Apologized for missing the last meeting.
  - o Officers are buried in work. One new officer has been hired and will be in training.
  - o In October, a systematic inspection was completed in Magnolia Gardens. In November, a systematic inspection was completed in Lake Forest.
  - o The new fiscal year numbers started on September 1, 2013. Since that time officers completed the following inspections: 22 commercial, 2 illegal signs, 139 junk vehicles, 6 litter signs, 3132 nuisance, 322 residential, 140 unsafe structures, and zoning, for a total of 4204 inspections in approximately 75 days, in addition to 2 systematic inspections (Magnolia Gardens and Lake Forest)
  - o Code officers are heavily involved in Operation Urban Blight.
  - o He wished everyone Happy Holidays and expressed appreciation for support from Zone 5 residents. He expressed special appreciation for Chair Solomon's support.
  - o Chair Solomon thanked Mr. Connell for his work in Zone 5. Vice Chair McIntosh presented Mr. Connell with a certificate of appreciation signed by Chair Solomon.

- Housing & Community Development Division: Neighborhood Coordinator, Mary Beth Ridderman staffed this meeting. She provided no report.

<u>7. Elections:</u> Nomination Subcommittee Chair Roxsan Currier assumed Chairmanship of the meeting for the election.
