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#### 1. Call to Order/Verify Quorum

The meeting was held in a temporary location. Chair Bobby Taylor called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. A quorum was verified by Mary Beth Ridderman.

## 2. Approval of the Previous Meeting Summary

A motion to approve the June summary was made by Mr. Berry and seconded by Bill Baker. The vote: All in favor.

## 3. Staff Reports

- JSO (Jacksonville Sheriff's Office) no representative.
- Mayor's Liaison Agriculture Extension Office Director, Mike Sweat's absence was excused.
- **Duval County Public Schools** Vicki Drake's absence was excused.
- FDOT (Florida Department of Transportation) Thomas Hill reported:
  - A contract change involving ITS devices on I-295. Changes are due in July 2013.
  - o Electrical repairs are scheduled for Fall 2013 on the Sisters Creek Bridge.
  - o Joint project replacing drainage end caps to meet safety specifications on Dunn Avenue.
  - o A concern was expressed that no end caps were installed at Bridges Road. Mr. Hill said he will talk with the project manager. At this time, only 54% of the project is completed.
  - o Overhead ITS devices are being installed at Airport Road.
  - Expect lane closures on Sisters Creek Bridge tonight only. A brief discussion was held regarding the bridge replacement time schedule. A request was made for a presentation.

- o Housing and Community Development Division Mary Beth Ridderman reported the Housing and Community Development Division's training for Homeowner Associations, Townhomes & Condo Associations has been rescheduled to September 17, 5:30 p.m. in the Ed Ball Building, Room 851. - o **Municipal Code Compliance Division** Bruce Chauncey reported:
  - The newly-hired third officer is on duty working in the community.
  - A resident of San Mateo raised the issue of recreational vehicle parking long-term, possibly with persons living in them close to or on the right-of-way, creating a safety hazard by obstructing street views. Mr. Chauncey said he will check the area.
  - A resident expressed concern about blight caused by the poor condition of homes in foreclosure or short-sale status. He is submitting CARE issues and encouraged code compliance officers to cite them.
  - A concern was expressed regarding motor homes permanently parked on vacant lots.
  - A concern was expressed regarding pools, green or black from neglect, creating health and safety issues.
  - A concern was expressed about a hazardous tree in the right-of-way at 301 Baisden Rd. It has been reported but nothing has been done. Mr. Chauncey said he will look into it.
  - Chair Taylor asked residents to call 630-CITY (2489) to report violations.
  - Mr. Berry reminded residents that Zone 6 only has 3 officers and they work from reported violations. Please call 630-CITY.
  - A resident expressed appreciation for Municipal Code Compliance officers' work.

- Parks & Recreation Sherry Wilson' absence was excused.
- National Park Service Shauna Allen reported:
  - o The Department of Environmental Protection is investigating the issue of marsh grass dying.

- 4. Presentation: Shirley Dasher presented information about Clearly Jacksonville. Clearly Jacksonville is a non-profit organization offering free public service announcements on electronic billboards. The billboards display Amber Alerts, Silver Alerts, FBI Most Wanted alerts and emergency management alerts such as flooding, detours and road closures. Amber Alerts and Silver Alerts preempt paying customers and are "up" and displayed within 7 minutes of submission from a law enforcement agency. Free service is available to non-profit organizations. Space may be available for announcements from CPAC or neighborhood associations. For more information, contact Shirley Dasher at <a href="mailto:ccssd@comcast.net">ccssd@comcast.net</a>.
  - A discussion was held during which one member expressed concern about a specific billboard that is not in compliance on I-95 East Bound near Arlington. Another member expressed concerns about visual pollution caused by billboards.

# **5. Chair's Report** – Chair Bobby Taylor:

- Welcomed all visitors.
- Presented appointment letters from Mayor Brown to Pastor Mark Bivins and Sharon Bivins, representing Blue Grass Northwood and Patrick Bennett representing Northside Business Leaders.
- Expressed his concern that the current tax rate does not properly support efficient operation of government. He expressed concern regarding further cuts that have been proposed one such cut is to close city pools in Summer, 2014. Chair Taylor said he wants the city to be better and that cannot be done with further cuts. He suggested members contact their City Council Members.
  - o A member expressed concern that increased library conference center rental costs (previously \$800 to current \$2400) have driven out customers who would plan events to attract visitors to downtown.
  - o A concern was expressed regarding raising taxes. The Chair said the average homeowner would pay less than \$50 per year additional taxes.
  - o A concern was expressed that taxes are based on assessments.
  - o A concern was expressed about companies considering relocating to Jacksonville.
- **6. Elected Officials Reports** Evelyn Coney, Soil & Water Conservation District, Group 2, reported she is working on a presentation about soil and water.

• **Governmental Affairs** – The Vice Chair/Governmental Affairs Subcommittee Chair, Rex Neidlinger led this portion of the meeting. The following items were discussed or voted upon:

#### 8. Unfinished Business -

- Last month, Tommy Ruffin introduced the subject of safety on Lem Turner near Percy Road. His neighborhood requested installation of a signal light at Lem Turner and Percy and lowered, consistent speed limit signage (45 m.p.h.) A discussion was held. FDOT inspected the location and found that the speed limit posting is correct. FDOT looked at crash incidents (3 in 4 years). A traffic signal is not indicated but FDOT will conduct a signal warrant study. A motion was made by Tommy Ruffin to prepare a letter of support. A second was made by Dick Berry. All were in favor. Tommy Ruffin will complete a letter for the Chair's signature.
- Evelyn Coney inquired about the CPAC's position on amending the Biker's Bill to request that May of
  every year be recognized as Motorcycle Awareness Week. A brief discussion was held: at last
  month's meeting the CPAC voted to prepare a letter which was signed and sent to City Council in
  June 2013.
