1. Call to Order/Verify Quorum

Chair Mike Getchell called the meeting to order at 4:02 p.m. A quorum was verified by Mary Beth Ridderman.

2. Approval of the Previous Meeting Summary

A motion to approve the October summary, as amended was made by Jack Stuart and seconded by Bill Baker. The vote: All in favor.

3. Staff Reports

- JSO (Jacksonville Sheriff's Office) Assistant Chief T.C. Davis reported:
 - o City wide, violent crime is down 7.89 percent.
 - o City wide, there is a 40 year low in crime.
 - o Property crime is up 7 percent. A lot of the increase in crime is related to the holidays. Please secure your car, lock valuables in the trunk, don't be overloaded with packages when walking to the car, be aware of your surroundings, pay attention to people, be cautious about "clicking" the car doors too far ahead of time someone could be waiting near your car before or after you arrive.
 - o During the holidays, increases are expected in home break-ins and robberies to individuals.
 - A concern was expressed about vehicles being operated without lights during rain or after dark.
- Mayor's Liaison Agriculture Extension Office Director, Mike Sweat's absence was excused.
- Duval County Public Schools No representative.
- FDOT (Florida Department of Transportation) Thomas Hill reported:
 - o I-95 Overland bridge project has regional significance. It extends from JTB to Atlantic Boulevard. It is a 5 year project that will cause a lot of congestion.
 - o I-95 ITS project is ongoing.
 - o Main Street Bridge over the Trout River repairs will be completed in late 2013.
 - o An upcoming project is Heckscher Drive/SR 105, electrical and mechanical repairs to the Sister's Creek Bridge will begin January 2013 and should finish Summer, 2013. The purpose is to maintain the bridge while the new bridge is being built.
 - Airport Boulevard ITS overhead signs
 - o Mathews Bridge lane closures and detours expected this weekend
 - Public Notices
 - Public Meeting Work Projects, Dec. 10, 5:30 p.m. at FDOT, 2198 Edison Ave.
 - Public Meeting Highway 301 and I-10 Ramp and Interchange, Nov. 26, 4:30 Baldwin Senior Center.
 - o James Bennett would like to present information on managed lanes/express lanes (toll lanes) on I-295. I-295 and I-95 are being redesigned for these express lanes. Tolls will be paid via Sun Pass.
 - Concerns were expressed about the toll lanes.

Neighborhoods

- o **Housing and Community Development Division** Mary Beth Ridderman reported her team is working on process mapping, providing details about each duty they perform.
- o **Municipal Code Compliance Division** Bruce Chauncey reported a Zone 6 officer is retiring, but permission has been received to hire another person.
 - A concern was expressed that The Heckscher Drive Community Club was incorrectly cited for tall grass. The property is next door to the club and belongs to COJ. It is now

fenced and the club can no longer mow the lot which is adjacent to club property. Municipal Code Compliance Supervisor Bruce Chauncey will investigate and make needed corrections.

- Planning & Development At the request of CPAC, Gary Kresel, City Planner Supervisor, Planning & Development Department, presented information about the proposed text amendments. A lengthy discussion followed each amendment. (see Governmental Affairs).
- Parks & Recreation Elizabeth Palmer reported:
 - o Thomas Creek Preserve boat ramps, tables and grills are ready for use.
 - o Ms. Palmer placed Fall/Winter Activity guides on the registration table. Lots of walks and tours are planned.
 - o The Holiday Blast Camp was announced. It is a free program offered at all city recreation centers. Ms. Palmer provided flyers.

- National Park Service Shauna Allen reported:
 - Erosion of washed-in beach sand at Ft. George Inlet is reaching a critical point, choking off access and main source of water to Timucuan Preserve. A new task force is being formed to address this problem.
 - o Save the Date Science Symposium, Jan. 25, 2013
 - o Save the Date Timucuan Discover Day, Jan. 26, 2013. These celebrations kick off a year-long celebration of the 25th anniversary of Timucuan Preserve.

- 4. Presentation: Laura Lane presented information about JCCI 2025, a large community effort to develop a vision for Jacksonville for 2025. She distributed a printed survey, which is also available online at www.jax2025.org. SD will be responsible for preparation, evaluation and review of zoning applications, certificates, administrative deviances, variances, waivers, exceptions, amendments and modifications as required by Chapter 656.
20126012	Discuss	Grants final approval to amend Future Land Use Element of 2030 Comp Plan to reduce minimum gross density housing units in MDR of Urban priority, Urban, Suburban and Rural areas from 10 units to greater than 7 units per acre.
