#### Overview

JTA is enhancing its transit system with North, Southeast, East and Southwest limited stop corridors connecting through downtown Jacksonville. The system, branded as "MAX", is an integral piece of JTA's transit vision, taking mass transit in Northeast Florida to an exciting new level. MAX is not about speed; it is about transit efficiency and convenience; key elements for today's business professionals. Features will include:

- ▼ Low-floor branded buses that arrive every 10 minutes during peak hours and 15 minutes off-peak
- ▼ Branded, weather-protected, stations with schedule information, lighting and ticket machines at key locations
- ▼ Operation in both mixed traffic and dedicated- lane segments in selected areas
- ▼ Transit signal priority at intersections allow buses to extend green signal time
- ▼ Connections with other JTA services

## Benefits

MAX will offer customers a premium transit service on more heavily-traveled corridors. The system will serve as a critical element of JTA's transit system, providing enhanced convenience, reliability and connectivity to travel seamlessly through Jacksonville.




Downtown Jacksonville will serve as the hub of the MAX system, integrating with the Skyway services as well as future rail transit. In addition to having system-wide amenities, downtown stations will encompass decorative brick bands, landscaping and decorative street lighting where feasible. The system and associated improvements are also designed to better link the North and South banks.
