Call to Order

Chair Parrish called the meeting to order at 5:32 p.m. in Training Room 110 of the Ed Ball Building, 214 N. Hogan Street and welcomed everyone.

Chair Parrish stated that there would be a new way of producing the minutes from the tape recording and asked members to state their name and the group they represent which would be most helpful for the recording.

Approval of the Minutes

The following corrections were made: In the Municipal Code section – they do have a few pickup trucks. Ms. Merrick – the correct name is the Plaza Condominiums. Member Hamilton made a Motion to accept the minutes as corrected. A second was made by Member Noonan. The Vote: All in favor; none opposed.

Guest Speakers

Department of Health – Director of Community Relations Jocelyn Turner introduced the Director of Public Health, Communication and Planning Charles Griggs, Dr. Gail McLaughlin and Cynthia Benjamin, TB Program Manager. Ms. Benjamin presented a PowerPoint on TB (attached).

She did speak on the lone standing hospital in Lantana, Florida for people that are non-compliant in taking their TB medication. They could be committed for 6 to 9 months. Dr. McLaughlin stated that in homeless shelters there are environmental controls that need to be followed. There is one shelter that does not have the funds available to have the controls in place but have a verbal commitment to do so. Members had questions and concerns on the following: How long is the verbal commitment? It is for 6 weeks. They are working with the Federal Government to work on the funding. If a person is exposed and not contagious can they get TB again? It could happen but not that often. What can the city do better that they are not doing? The lack of controls in the homeless shelters is one of the largest problems. Ms. Benjamin can be reached at 253-1070. Chair Parrish thanked the Department of Health for this useful information.

City Beautiful Jax - Lara Diettrich, Executive Director, introduced herself. She is an Urban Planner that worked in the Planning Department for the City of Jacksonville for 6 years. City Beautiful Jax use to be JaxPride. There was some confusion with the name and are rebranding. City Beautiful Jax Coalition provides leadership and advocates for a superior quality of life in Jacksonville through visual enhancement of the natural and built environment. In 1989 they were established to advocate for neighborhoods. In 1985 JCCI did a proactive study about visual pollution and they have been working on this ever since. Blight breeds blight and beauty breeds beauty. If you or your neighborhood organization is interested in doing a neighborhood inventory study please call 551-6969. Members asked if there was a charge for this service. No, everything is at no cost but they do have different levels of membership. The participation level starts at \$20 not \$25 as the brochure states. Ms. Diettrich introduced Board Member Bill Brinton. Mr. Brinton spoke about the first neighborhood they worked on was the Eastside with Ms. Flossie Brunson. He talked about various issues they have worked on such as snipe signs, graffiti and litter. Member Miller stated that in 1992 JaxPride was very helpful to Good Neighbor M.A.N.I.A. Mr. Brinton stated that the original purpose was that of advocacy and visual enhancements. - At Klutho and Shell Park near 8th Street work had begun but has stopped. What happened?
- At Johnny Ford Elementary a few summers ago they had done remediation work what is going on now with the digging?
- Member Miller stated there was an elderly couple in Phase 1 that has not been confirmed yet. Can you please call her and let her know when it should begin?

Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) – Jim Green reported on the following:

- Matthews Bridge – the suggestion on having the bridge detours listed on 511 – there is no funding in place for this at this time. There will be westbound lane closures tonight to Friday. This weekend a full closure of the bridge to prepare for sandblasting.
- Starting this Friday for one week – 3 railroad crossing will have detours for repairs at McCoy's Creek, Forest Street and Lewis and King Street. Be prepared for detours.
- The MLK interchange project has started and will continue to 2013 along with resurfacing.
- Main Street over the Trout River will have resurfacing in 2013.
- I-10 and I-95 Interchange the Governor has said to go bold on major gateways with landscaping. There will be more than normally done.

Members had questions and concerns on the following:

- The railroad crossing at 17th Street and Phoenix is very bumpy.
- Will there be landscaping on MLK at Myrtle and Fairfax? No.
- On the Northside of the Main Street/Trout River Bridge going to the zoo, it is very treacherous for a bike rider. It needs to be made safe.
- On Kings Road going south there needs to be a pedestrian light and a green turning light for right turns.
- At the 5-Point Intersection there is a need for a signal.



HEALTH DCHE

What is Tuberculosis (TB)?

- Mycobacterium Tuberculosis
- Usually attacks lungs
- Untreated can be fatal
- Once the leading cause of death in the United States
- One of the World's deadliest diseases



HEALTH DCHE

How is TB Transmitted?

- Coughing
- Sneezing
- Laughing
- Singing
- Talking



HEALTH DCHE



What are the symptoms of TB?

- Chronic Cough (3 weeks or more)
- Shortness of Breath
- Chest Pain
- Night Sweats
- Fever
- Loss of appetite
- Weight loss (unexplained)
- Fatigue or Malaise
- Hemoptysis

HEALTH DCHE

How do you detect TB infection?

- The TB skin TST
- Special blood tests IGRAs
T-Spot.TB
Quantiferon Gold- In Tube

HEALTH DCHE

What are the chances of becoming infected?

- Frequency of exposure
- Duration of exposure
- Proximity of exposure
- How infectious is the source case
- The overall health of the contact (person being exposed)
- Age of person exposed

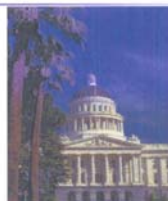
HEALTH DCHE

What are the chances of developing TB Disease once infected?

- **Infection and no risk factors-** 5% the first two years after infection and 10% chance over lifetime. (with no treatment)
- **Infection and Diabetes-** 30% over lifetime (with no treatment)
- **Infection and untreated HIV infection-** 7%-10% PER YEAR with no treatment for Latent TB infection (LTBI)



Florida Statutes Chapter 392 is TB Control



Because tuberculosis is a highly **infectious** disease . . . we needed a highly **effective** statute to combat it's resurgence . . . thus the birth of Chapter 392, Fla. Stat.



Tuberculosis Control Act Chapter 392, Florida Statutes



"Tuberculosis is a highly contagious infection that is sometimes fatal and constitutes a serious threat to the public."



Tuberculosis Control Act Definitions

Active Tuberculosis

Tuberculosis is considered active until cured.

Treatment to Cure

Completion of treatment . . . and it's the doctor's call.

Directly Observed Therapy

Not that we don't trust you . . . and let us watch you take your medicine.



Tuberculosis? You Must Tell the Department of Health!!

- 392.53 Florida Statutes – Reporting is Required
 - Each person who makes a diagnosis of TB or who treats a person with TB and each lab that performs a test on a specimen that reveals the presence of TB shall report such information to the DOH within 72 hours after the TB is discovered.
 - Reporting may be either electronic, telephonic or FAX



Why tell DOH?




- So that the department can commence its contact investigation
- 392.54, Florida Statutes
 - Anyone who is reasonably suspected:
 - of having active TB
 - or of having been exposed to active TB is contacted.




So what if I don't report . . .

- You may be subjected to a fine of up to \$500 **and** the DOH shall report the violation to the regulatory agency that is responsible for licensing the person or the laboratory
- Section 392.67, F.S.


