Call to Order

Dewey Marshall called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m., established that a quorum was present, the meeting started with the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.

Chairs Report

Dewey informed the group that the new Flood Zone Maps have been completed. If you are interested in determining if you home is located in a flood zone visit www.maptherisk.com and enter your zip code. There will be a community meeting on

the Flood Zones on May 11, 2010 ~ 6:00 p.m. at the Regency Branch Library. There was also an attempt by the Chair to discuss the topics of Internet Cafes and the new Policy on Foreclosure management. Letters from the Urban Core CPAC were sent to all of the GAB CPAC members on May 4th to review; the motion to discuss these topics was made, but there was no dialogue on either topic. Dewey again asked the group to read the letters so it could be discussed at the June meeting.

Approval of the Minutes

Motion to approve the April 12, 2010 meeting summary was made. The motion was properly seconded and approved by the group.

Speakers

Neil Armingeon, St. Johns Riverkeeper, informed the group that decisions are being made in regard to the applications that Seminole County has submitted in order to siphon 80 million gallons of water a day from the St. Johns River. Government requires that long term studies are completed to look at the water needs of the future and it has been determined that by 2030 in our district we will need 90 million gallons a day more than what the aquifer can supply. The first week of May there will be a public meeting in Green Cove Springs to discuss our future water needs where our region is going to get the additional water needed to sustain our region. Neil also supported the Irrigation and Fertilizer ordinances that the City adopted; conservation is recommended.

Subcommittee Reports

PARKS & RECREATION – Chair Dewey Marshall – reminded the group that there are a number of wonderful parks in the district, please go out and enjoy them.

BEAUTIFICATION – Chair Larry Belge – expressed a concern in regard to the P.A.L. and other City parks leaving their lights on (wasting money) after hours or at odd times.

LAND USE & ZONING – Chair Mike Anania – the subcommittee made a motion on the following items.

Support Administrative Deviation AD-10-39 to deviate the maximum lot coverage from 35% to 46.02% in a PUD zoning district to allow a back patio roof at 1075 Jones Creek Drive ~ the HOA agreed with the construction and the deviation does not adversely affect the neighbors and neighborhood.

Opposition to the Administrative Deviation AD-10-41 to deviate the front yard setback from 20 feet to 6.5 feet in a RLD-60 to allow for a carport because the structure was not permitted in 1997 so it does not meet regulations, thus making the structure a violation.

Opposition to the Exception E-10-28 to allow outside display of merchandise on 0.26 acres in a CCG-1 zoning district at 6222 Merrill Road because the proposed use would set a precedent along Merrill Road, is inconsistent with the NAP, will obstruct traffic entering Merrill Road and not allow in the CCG-1 zoning district.

Support for Ordinance 2010-376 (2009D-002) and Ordinance 2010-377 to change the land from 63.14 acres from BP and RPI to CGC and rezone 70.26 acres from IBP, CO and PUD to PUD zoning district to allow for commercial retail uses on the north side of Atlantic Blvd, 2600 feet west of Kernan Blvd.

Support for ordinance 2010-341 to rezone 3.65 acres from PUD & CN to PUD zoning district to allow CN and CCG-1 commercial retail uses on the Sourheast corner of Monument Road and Cobblestone Parkway.

Opposition to the Administrative Deviation AD-10-43 to deviate the front yard setback from 20 feet to 7 feet in a RLD-60 zoning district to allow a carport at 1110 Nightingale Road between Halafax Road and Nightingale Road.

Opposition to the Administrative Deviation AD-10-22 to deviate the height of fence from 4 feet to 6 feet in a RLD-60 zoning district along Brunswick Road at 214 Glynlea Road on the corner of Glynlea Road and Brunswick Road.

Opposition to the Administrative Deviation AD-10-38 to deviate the front yard setback from 20 feet to 5.5 feet and side yard from 5 feet to 1.5 feet in a RLD-60 zoning district to allow a shed at 6210 Columbine Drive between Red Oak Drive and Rogero Road.

The letters are attached at the end of the summary.

After the LUZ Subcommittee Chair submitted his report, Al Cherry added that the LUZ Subcommittee also discussed additional issues in regard to the 2 town centers that are in the Old Arlington area. The discussion was brought to the attention of the full CPAC, thus starting a lively discussion with the full CPAC in regard to the Arlington Road Town Center, the Rogero Road Town Center, the proposed Rogero Road Roundabout and the palm trees that are planted on Rogero Road between Fort Caroline Road and Merrill Road. The discussion of these issues went back and forth; supporters from opposing sides presented their views. A motion was made by Al Cherry that the CPAC express their continued support of the Arlington Town Centers and the Roundabout and the CPAP should send a new support letter with the previous support letters that the CPAC sent in the past attached. After the additional discussion it was voted to table this motion.

Councilmember Yarborough was in attendance and he stated that 2 of the CPAC members had emailed their concerns in regard to the proposed roundabout and possible removal of palm trees that were/are planted as part of the Rogero Town Center project in the residential area. He stated that he is not getting much response in support of the roundabout and at this time there is not any funds allocated to build the roundabout. Also, there was discussion about the possibility of removing palm trees from the Rogero Town Center project (between Merrill Road & Fort Caroline Road). Councilmember Yarborough confirmed that the 39-40 trees will be removed and relocated within the district; he also stated that he was open to suggestions for areas that need beatification and could benefit by planting a palm tree or 2 in that location.

MEMBERSHIP – Chair: Eddi Parsons – not present, but Chair Dewey Marshall read a letter on her behalf; The Membership Subcommittee made the following motion: *Opposition to the rumored re-organization of the CPAC's.* A letter was sent to Mayor Peyton, the Director of Planning & Development and the Director of Housing & Neighborhoods.

TRANSPORTATION – Co-Chairs Roger Sharp and Richard Witzel – not present

ENVIRONMENT – Chair Lad Hawkins – not present

T.R.U.E Commission – Marcella Lowe – informed the group that the commission has been very active the last 2 weeks. One of the budget items that they have reviewed recently is the Health component ~ this is the money that the City provides to Shands Jacksonville to provide healthcare for the Duval County residents that do not have health care. In this review it was determined that the State of Florida needs to contribute more money to this program. The Commission is also looking at Ordinance 2010-216 ~ adjusting fees to cover the current cost to complete that service. For additional information, visit www.MyJaxBudget.com.

Craig Airport Advisory Committee – Dave Evans – 2 fixed base operators has filed suite because they need to extend the runway.

Growth Management Visioning Plan – Mike Anania – working on the first draft ~ they are scheduled to deliberate for at least 1 year before filing the final draft.

Staff Reports:

MAYOR'S REPRESENTATIVE – Kelley Borree, - still actively working on the budget; the initial budget is due in May and the final budget will be reviewed in July. City Council will work with the proposed budget and get to move some of the funds around and also add reductions. The final Community Budget Meeting will be held on May 20th in Jacksonville Beach; please visit www.MyJaxBudget.com for complete details. Reddy Point Park re-opened last week, there is a lot of activity going on at the Arboritium and the JazzFest will be held over Memorial Day weekend.

JSO – Lt. Amy informed the group that both violent crime and personal crime throughout the district. There was a recent increase in the break ins at storage facilities. There is an upcoming ShAdCo Safety Fair that will be held on Saturday, May 15th from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at Regency Square Mall. The fair will be held at the end of the mall near Sears; there will be information outside and inside the mall. Education and information will be provided by American Red Cross, CSX, Boy Scouts, Empowerment Parent, FBI, 1st Coast Crime Stoppers, Ident-a-kid, JFRD, States Attorney's Office, U.S. Army, US Secret Service, Youth Crisis Center, JSO Air Unit, Bicycle rodeo, to name a few.

DUVAL COUNTY SCHOOLS – Selinda Keyes, informed the group that the schools have experience with theft too; a number of their air conditioners have been stolen from schools. In the mean time, the schools are waiting for their grades. 14 schools have had low grades and it is important for them improve their performance. The last day of school is June 11th.

FDOT – Jim Green, informed the group that the resurfacing of Atlantic Blvd. (from Kings Street to University Blvd.) has been completed, the traffic signals on/near the Arlington Expressway (near the Sears entrance) will be upgraded and work on the metal expansion joints will continue.

PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT – Ed Lukacovic – informed the group that the Planning and Development Department has made some changes and moved staff members around. Ed took this opportunity to introduce Paul Davis as the new Planner that will be working with the GAB CPAC. Ed told the group that really enjoyed working with them and reminded them that he is not leaving the city, so he will still be available if you have any questions or concerns. Luke's phone number is 255-7841.

MUNICIPAL CODE – George Tawes - no report ~ finishing up a community sweep in Southside Estates; no further details at this time but available for questions.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT – Neighborhood Coordinator Rosemary Wesolowski informed the group that the Housing and Neighborhoods Department reminded the group that the Regency Branch Library will be closed from May 20 to May 31st. The library is scheduled to be reopened before the June meeting. On June 4th, the State

Attorneys office will host a local seminar on Anti-Crime Initiative Strategies for Safe and Sustainable Community; details are provided on a flyer in the back. Also, on May 17th there will be a seminar on Hurricane Preparedness in the Ed Ball Building, details are provided in a flyer in the back.


