Call to Order

Pat Corrado, SE CPAC Chair, called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

<u>Speaker</u>

Charles McBurney, Florida House of Representatives, District 16, spoke on the 2011 Legislative Session which was greatly impacted by our economy. Legislatures were faced with 12% unemployment and a mega-million dollar deficit, but by constitutional law they are obligated to have a balanced budget.

This fiscal year the budget \$69 billion dollars; \$1.4 billion less that last years \$70.4 billion dollar budget and the state did not have stimulus money this year. It was quite challenging to work on the budget, but our legislatures were able to present a balanced budget which can be broken down:

As a champion for Public Education, Representative McBurney has worked diligently to direct more dollars into the classroom and away from bureaucracy and to fulfill a pledge make to Jacksonville by sponsoring and passing into law the State's New Civics Education Bill.

- Bob Crawford, Code Compliance Supervisor: informed the group that 1500 inspections have been completed since last months meeting. Systematic inspections were completed in Craven, Goodby's Lake and Brierwood. There was some discussion in regard to the incomplete condos on Goodby's creek (Baymeadows Rd and San Jose Blvd). If there appears to trespassers on the property anytime of the day or night, please call JSO 630-0500 for immediate assistance and also report the trespassing to 630-CITY for Code Compliance to inspect.
- Quinn Bledsoe, Recreation & Community Services Department: informed the group that summer camps have started and there are 4 summer camps in the Southeast District. Summer Night Lights (SNL) JaxParks and the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office have partnered to keep the lights on at eight JaxParks locations this summer, Fridays and Saturdays from 7 p.m. to midnight. One of the parks that is offing the SNL is Beachwood Community center near FCCJ South Campus. The program's goal is to reduce youth violence and crime, offer hope and develop a sense of community and neighborhood pride. The SNL Youth Squad will return this year, with more job opportunities for youth ages 16 18 to work as community outreach coordinators. In addition to receiving stipends and job training, the youth will also participate in an Outward Bound training program. The City of Jacksonville will be sponsoring fireworks for the 4th of July.

Chair's Report -

- Voted and approved May 2011 meeting summary.
- Recognized newly elected Council members Lori Boyer, Matt Schellenberg and Bill Gulliford.
- Announced that the Growth Management and Transportation Subcommittees have combined and Danny Becton will chair the "new" combined subcommittee.

- Informed the group that the Mayor's Transition Team has submitted their report. The report is 279 pages and is available online, but a copy will be emailed to the CPAC members.
- Encouraged all the new council members to send a representative to the CPAC meetings.

Subcommittee Chair Updates:

<u>Beautification and Environment - Chairperson: Dick Cardell:</u> reminded the group that the drought has taken a toll on all of our vegetation. With wildfires being a serious threat, please exam the landscaping around your house and make sure there isn't a fire hazard. Trees have suffered too; take the time to look at the vitality and safety of your trees.

<u>Economic Development– Chairperson: Gloria Stephens:</u> introduced letter writing. "Bring The Noise Campaign" by showing their support for port enhancements through a community letter writing campaign. Citizens are encouraged to sent letters to a variety of political officials (city, state and federal) in a plea to help our port. Organizations are encouraged to host their own letter writing campaigns. Visit www.bringthenoisecampaign.com for complete details.

A motion was made and seconded to have the SE CPAC write a letter to share with our political officials. There was significant discussion in regard to the study that is being conducted by the Army Corp of Engineers.

After considerable discussion the motion was amended; the motion is: The SE CPAC will participate in the "Bring the Noise" campaign depending on the outcome of the study that will be conducted by the Army Corp of Engineers to determine if there will be any salt water intrusion into our aquifer if JaxPort deepens the shipping channel to 50 feet. The vote was unanimous to approve this amended motion.

<u>Education - Co-Chairs: George Banks and John Waddell:</u> announced that the CPAC will not have a school representative for the summer.

<u>Growth Management & Transportation - Chairman: Danny Becton</u>: Informed the group that City Council District 13 will be split and form a new city council district. In effort to have open dialogue on the Redistricting process, the Growth Management and Transportation Subcommittee will host a Communitywide Redistricting meeting. At the meeting the group will look at maps and prepare recommendations for the Planning and Development Department.
