Guest Speakers

<u>JEA</u> - Contract Employee Judy Urback, Conservation & Efficiency Specialist gave a presentation on ShopSmart and asked if any organization would like a presentation to sign up tonight. Here are the details: ShopSmart provides financial incentives for customers to:

- Get a home energy audit, and
- Make upgrades that will improve their home's energy efficiency.
- 100% rebate on diagnostic energy audit if homeowner makes upgrades that are projected to reduce energy consumption by 15%
- Low- or no-interest financing for upgrades through partner lending institutions
- Rebates on: window tinting, insulation, efficient heating and cooling systems, duct repair, solar water heaters, efficient lighting and bulbs and efficient appliances

JEA reps would like to speak at HOA meetings to:

- Identify residents who are interested in learning about ShopSmart
- Recruit a host and attendees for a "Home Energy Makeover Block Party"
- Host has home energy audit performed
- Then hosts a "party" with about 10 neighbors (homes may be similar)
- At party, auditor demonstrates audit process and shares results

JEA's goal is for residents to get energy audits (25% discount up front) and improve energy efficiency of homes (with the remaining cost of audit reimbursed after upgrades are made). Members had questions on the following:

- Will the company that does the audit do the repairs? Some companies do and some don't. Be sure to get a JEA approved contractor to do the work. Rebates will not apply to home owners that do it themselves.
- Will the rebates apply to new homes? The program is targeted for homes 15 years and older but the rebate will apply to new homes.

Duval Emergency Preparedness – Liz Henderson, Exercise and Training Coordinator talked about being prepared for any disaster. Jacksonville has been very fortunate this past year but need to be prepared for this upcoming year. The Legends Center Evacuation Shelter is the only City run shelter in Jacksonville. That being said they need volunteers to run the shelter in an emergency. The Legends Center will be a special needs center with a nurse/doctor available. This shelter is in your community. Free training is available with CERT (Community Emergency Response Team). Claudia Scott invited members to sign up for these classes. They will be for 8 weeks – 1 night per week from 6 to 9 p.m. starting on Thursday, Feb. 2, 2012 at the Legends Center. CERT training has neighbors coming to your aid in time of a disaster when first responders can't get there. Basic first aid, CPR, how to use a fire extinguisher, life savings techniques and what to do in a variety of emergencies will be taught. Members had a variety of questions. <u>Project New Ground</u> – Sam Holman, The Hester Group reported on the following:

- The contractors have slowed down during the holidays
- Phase 2 is completed for Forest Street and Phase 1 for Cleveland St.
- Phase 2 for the Brown's dump site will start in February. Each phase has 100 parcels.
- They will start in June/July in Brooklyn, Mixon Town and Springfield.

FDOT – Thomas Hill reported on the following:

Projects under construction:

- Interstate 10 Adding lanes and reconstructing from east of Halsema Road to Lane Avenue (8.2 miles). Hubbard Construction Company of Winter Park began January 12, 2009 and should finish on time in the fall of 2012 at a cost of \$58.9 million.
- Main Street (US 17) Resurface from Trout River Boulevard to Trout River Bridge and relocate roadway under the bridge. Also reconstruct the Trout River Bridge fender system. Superior Construction Company of Jacksonville should begin in the fall of 2011 and finish in the fall of 2013 at a cost of \$5,649,714.71.

Lane closures:

- I -10 will close ramps tonight
- Golfair will close lanes for routine maintenance to Friday

Follow up from the November meeting: Projects in Five-Year Work Program:

- Beaver Street (US 90) Rebuild railroad crossing near Hammond Avenue in 2012/13 at estimated cost of \$250,000.
- **Beaver Street (US 90)** Resurface from west of McDuff Avenue to east of Stockton Street (.9 mile). Bids to open in August 2013 at estimated cost of \$1.6 million.
- **Dunn Avenue (State Road 104)** Resurface from New Kings Road (US 1) to Interstate 295 (2 miles). Bids to open in August 2012 at an estimated cost of \$1.8 million.
- Dunn Avenue (State Road 104) Resurface from Biscayne Boulevard to Interstate 95 ramps (1 mile). Bids to open in August 2013 at an estimated cost of \$2 million.
- **Dunn Avenue (State Road 104)** Intersection improvements from west of Garden Boulevard to east of Walgreen's driveway. Bids to open in November 2012 at an estimated cost of \$400,000.
- Edgewood Avenue (State Road 111) Rebuild railroad crossing near 20th Street in 2012/13 at estimated cost of \$375,000.
- Interstate 295 Improvements at Dunn Avenue (State Road 104) interchange. Bids to open in August 2013 at estimated cost of \$935,000.
- Interstate 295 Resurface from Commonwealth Avenue to Trout River (6 miles). Bids to open in January 2103 at an estimated cost of \$10.6 million.
- Interstate 295 Interchange improvements at Pritchard Road in 2015/16 at estimated cost of \$6.5 million.
- Jones Road Replace Bridge over Six Mile Creek. Bids to open in October 2012 at an estimated cost of \$3.1 million.
- Lem Turner Road (State Road 115) Traffic signal system from 44th Street to Interstate 295 (6.7 miles) in 2012/13 at estimated cost of \$280,000.
- Main Street (US 17) Repairs to the Trout River Bridge. Bids to open in July 2012 at an estimated cost \$1.2 million.
- New Kings Road (US 1) Resurface from Borden Street to Edgewood Avenue (State Road 111) (1.2 mile). Bids to open in July 2012 at an estimated cost of \$2.4 million.
- New Kings Road (US 1) Resurface from Dunn Avenue (State Road 104) to Interstate 295 (2 miles). Bids to open in August 2012 at an estimated cost of \$1.8 million.

Members wanted to know how FDOT get funds for projects and how jobs are created. Funding comes from the gas tax receipts funding the roads and a little money from the tag tax fee. The jobs are contracted out from Tallahassee and they do not count heads for jobs. The Pickettville project has no money and is a dead project. Members wanted to know if the US 1 and MLK resurfacing project would go to the county line – not sure and will check on this. - Mayor Brown's Reform Plan Approved by City Council the bill (2011-0732) was passed by a 16-1 Council vote on Tuesday, Dec. 13, 2011. The bill passed after much review by City Council and a citizens' review panel. The mayor signed the bill into ordinance on Dec. 22. This marks phase-one of the mayor's reform plan. In the second phase, the mayor will work closely with department heads to examine the new structure of government for maximum savings and efficiency measures. Mayor Brown introduced legislation in November as a major step towards saving taxpayer money and reorganizing the city's workforce to deliver public services more effectively and efficiently. Target savings range from 10 to 15 percent of the city's General Fund. These will come from a variety of areas such as energy costs, better fleet management and employee health care costs.
