MAYOR PEYTON AND COUNCIL MEMBER HOLT CELEBRATE CECIL RECREATION TRAIL OPENING

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. Aug. 19, 2009—Mayor John Peyton and City Council member Ray Holt and the City of Jacksonville's Department of Recreation and Community Services (JaxParks) hosted a ribbon-cutting ceremony to celebrate the opening of the first phase of a network of new multi-use trails at Taye Brown Regional Park.



Spanning a total of 2.25 miles, a new paved multi-use trail will provide hikers, bikers and roller bladers recreational opportunities to explore the Cecil Field Conservation Corridor. In addition, an extensive network of non-paved trails totaling nearly 30 miles will be opened to the public for hiking, biking and equestrian users who wish to venture deeper into the forest.



Upon completion of additional phases, the paved recreational trail will ultimately span 9.5 miles and provide a link from Pope Duval Park to Sal Taylor Creek Preserve through the Cecil Field Conservation Corridor.
