

**DUVAL COUNTY DRIVER EDUCATION SAFETY TRUST FUND
ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

Upon receipt of the grant application, the Department of Recreation and Community Services shall allocate a proportionate share of the Driver Education Safety Trust Fund revenues to public and non-public school grant applicants that successfully meet eligibility requirements described below:

1. All public and non-public schools with students in grades 9-12 that offer driver education instruction programs are eligible to apply for a grant under **ORDINANCE 2002-1165-E**.
2. In order to maintain eligibility for grant funding, grant applicants must employ teachers that have received all relevant state certifications and that have passed applicable criminal background checks.
3. Additional criteria that may be considered as a basis for grant selection include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - A. The number of years the grant applicant has administered a driver education program;
 - B. The number of students who have successfully completed the grant applicant's driver education program in the last year of operation;
 - C. The extent to which the grant applicant's curriculum meets all applicable local, state and federal guidelines for the driver education program;
 - D. Development of measurable outcome goals for each participating school.
