

John Patrick Plumlee, M.A., PH.D.

J. Patrick Plumlee is an Associate Professor of Political Science and Public Administration at the University of North Florida. Dr. Plumlee is currently Director the graduate Master of Public Administration degree program. He has held a faculty position at UNF since 1983. Prior to coming to Jacksonville, he was an assistant professor in the Department of Political Science at Southern Methodist University in Dallas, Texas. At UNF, he served as acting and interim chairperson of the Department of Political Science and Sociology from 1987 to 1991, and as chairperson of the Department of Political Science and Public Administration from 1991 to 1996.

Dr. Plumlee earned a Ph.D. and an MA degree from Rice University in Houston, Texas, and also holds an MA degree in government from George Washington University. His undergraduate degree is from the University of Texas at Austin.

Dr. Plumlee's academic fields are American government and politics, specifically the presidency and U.S. defense policy, and public administration. He has written a number of articles for scholarly publications, and has appeared frequently on local media commenting on political and policy issues. From 2000 to 2006, under the auspices of the Florida Center for Public and International Policy, Dr. Plumlee conducted numerous ethical training workshops for City of Jacksonville employees. At UNF, he received the 2007-2008 Outstanding Faculty Service Award for his contributions to the university community.

He is married and resides in Mandarin, with one child currently attending Paxon High School. Dr. Plumlee is a U.S. Army veteran and served in South Vietnam from 1969-1970.
