JACKSONVILLE AVIATION AUTHORITY JULY 1, 2017 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2018 ANNUAL REPORT TO JACKSONVILLE CITY COUNCIL

The Jacksonville Aviation Authority (JAA) files this, its annual report summarizing activities and Board of Directors information, during the reporting period of July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018 (7/1/17-6/30/18).

Activities included:

- -Approval of a ten-year extension to the Airline Signatory Agreement
- -Expansion of airline service with the addition of Frontier Airlines and the addition of new service by several of the mainline carriers to Denver, Boston and Ft. Lauderdale.
- -Completion of several major maintenance projects in the JIA terminal complex in furtherance of the board's direction for a higher level of maintenance in the passenger terminal complex.
- -Board acceptance of several FDOT grants to fund projects at all four airports including a new air traffic control tower at Cecil Airport that will include a spaceport operations control center.
- -First series of cold rocket testing at the Cecil Spaceport along with the installation of a fabric hangar at the spaceport to handle future operations.
- -Board approval of a lease agreement with the City for the construction of a new fire station at Cecil Airport that will serve both airport and community needs.
- -Approval of a cost sharing agreement with the City to place a dedicated rescue unit at JIA which will improve response times at JIA as well as in the community.

The JAA Board of Directors met bi-monthly from 7/1/17-6/30/18.
