RE: FY 2014 Public Service Grant Annual Programmatic Update

Dear Council President Yarborough,

In accordance with the request of the Finance Committee, the Public Service Grant Council ("PSGC") met and reviewed the 4th quarter's public service grant recipient's programmatic accomplishments. This report is a summary of the accomplishments from October 1, 2013 to September 31, 2014 from the 31 contracted PSG programs across all four Priority Populations. **PSG dollars are used to leverage other services and funds; however, these numbers represent the actual services provided with PSG funds only.**

Homeless Persons & Families- **\$882,326** provided:

- 353 individuals with permanent housing
- 309 individuals obtained employment
- 129,857 meals & 355,618 pounds of food
- 28,036 homeless intake assessments
- Emergency shelter to 34,894 homeless individuals

Low-Income Persons & Families **\$666,142** provided:

- 64 Household prevent from being homeless/ evicted
- 38 individuals gained employment
- 179 individuals with training/assistance leading to employment
- 10,105 medical follow-up appointments
- 1,172 hearing aids from the 4,143 hearing evaluations
- 1,491 Case Management hours
- 52,709 bags of food & 59,270 pounds of food
- 60,680 calls for assistance with referrals for financial assistance
- 1,272 Safety Planning Assessments resulting in Zero Homicides
- 54 individuals received substance abuse treatment

Low-Income Homebound Seniors **\$18,631** provided:

- 2,981 home delivered meals to seniors

Adults with Physical, Behavioral, and Mental Disabilities **\$374,641** provided:

- 139 individuals with skills to gained employment
- 1,403 disabled individuals literacy training toward employment
- 724 Mental Health Screenings

Totaling \$1,941,740

I look forward to presenting our funding recommendations during the upcoming budget process.
