
The Goal is Ending Homelessness

Make homelessness rare, brief, and non reoccurring


Have the capacity to identify and assist anyone in a housing crisis in 30 days or less

Trends over six years








Point In Time Data- A Different View



2014 Assessments vs Placements




2015 Assessments vs Placements







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
