#### **CALL TO ORDER**

Dr. Lucinda Sonnenberg called the meeting to order at 5:01 p.m.

#### **COMMENTS FROM PUBLIC**

#### **MONTHLY REPORTS**

##### **Noise Complaints**

Chief Long reported the following:

- 35 noise complaints were received
- 0 NTC's were issued
- 3 complaint(s) were referred to the Jacksonville Sherriff's Office (JSO)
- 0 investigations were referred to enforcement

##### **Air & Odor Complaints**

Mr. Pace reported the following:

- 22 odor complaints were received, 2 validated
- 0 were referred to Enforcement
- 3 nuisance complaints were received, 2 validated
- 1 Air Pollution complaint was received, 0 validated
- 16 Open Burring complaints were received, 2 validated

- 1 referred to enforcement
- 88% of all odor complaints were investigated within 4 hours
- 95% of all air pollution complaints were investigated within 24 hours

Chief Long also shared:

- Hourly Criteria Pollutant Percent Data Recovery Rate Report
- Monthly AQI readings

### **LEGISLATIVE UPDATE**

James Richardson shared that HB/SB 552 was passed in both houses and signed by the Governor. This is the major water legislation previously discussed. The well stimulation bill is currently being considered by the House and is making its way through Senate committees. He described several amendments that have been attached, but suggested it would likely be passed. We continue to monitor several pieces of legislation and will keep the board abreast of issues of importance.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

- Discussion of Penalty Matrix – Chief Long and Tree Kilbourn, EQD Enforcement, shared historical information and background on the matrix used to set penalties due to enforcement. General discussion followed. There were suggestions provided on data to compile and how it should be compiled for the committee to review trends and activity going forward.

Chair Sonnenberg asked that the topic be placed on the April committee agenda to review data collected and continue the discussion.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

#### **Variances**

Andrew Sears, JEA, shared the following information:

- JEA Intercostal Waterway Transmission Tower Project Repair – Completed work includes; removal of concrete from tower support piles to expose steel beams comprising the piles, repair of corrosion of steel piles, and coating of steel piles to prevent future corrosion. The second phase of work, yet to be started, includes; dredging access to the remaining towers, similar work regarding the tower support piles, with setting of new concrete around all tower support piles. This second phase of work is anticipated to be from January 2016 through May 2017.
- JEA Well Construction – Construction commenced at the beginning of September with contractor mobilization and drilling activities. Work is complete on well 14 however the drill rig remains on site. Work on well 8A will commence approximately mid-March; this is a delay of approximately 45 days due to equipment failure on the rig. Work has thus far been completed in conformance with the JEA Noise Mitigation Plan incorporated as a condition of the variance. No nighttime work has been required.
