- 4. Elected Official's Report:
 - Darryl Willie, Duval County Public School Board Chairman, District 4, informed the CPAC members that on March 1, 2022, Duval County School Board approved a resolution that they will submit to City Council to be placed on an upcoming ballot to seek voters' approval for a one millage ad valorem tax. The purpose of the tax would be to attract and retain highly qualified teachers and staff through additional compensation. 5. Chairs Report: Chair Pryor thanked the City of Jacksonville for the demolition of the Berkman Plaza II building, located in the 500 block of East Bay Street, on Sunday, March 6, 2022.

6. Staff Reports:

• Jacksonville Sheriff Office (JSO)- Assistant Chief Bradley Shivers provided an overview of the JSO Co-Responders program. The program is staffed by 11 police officers and 11 mental health counselors who are assigned to assist the police officer when they respond to a call where individuals are experiencing a mental health crisis. The mental health co-responder program's hours of operation are Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m.- 5 p.m.

Municipal Code Compliance (MCCD): Robert Bautochka, Code Compliance Supervisor, reported that
in the last 30 days, MCCD completed 1,182 inspections in the Urban Core District and 16,134 inspections
in the past 365 days. In February 2022, the MCCD conducted a systematic inspection in the Phoenix
Neighborhood and will conduct a systematic inspection in the 29th and Chase neighborhood on April
11, 2022. The MCCD Jacksonville Assistance and Relief Program (JAR) still have funds available. The JAR

The motion was seconded; however, after much discussion, the motion failed (three members supported and four members opposed).
