## Guest Speaker

JTA - Endya Cummings, Business Relations and Development presented the "Fixed route bus system re-design" (maps were ha nded out)

- JTA will roll out changes on Monday, Oct. 5.
- The Skyway will not operate on weekends except for special events.
- The NS 19 Urban Core route the area in blue is new and the gold is old on the map.
- NS 3 and 14 route comesto Moncrief Ave. and Avenue B to Rosa Parksto Gateway and Wal-Mart and hops on to I-95 to Highlands Shopping Center - to River City Market Place.
- JTA goes to the aiport on the CT3 which stops at all 6 downtown hotels then goes to Rosa Parks Station to I-95 to River City Market Place and then goes to the aiport. It drops off and picksup at the baggage claim area busstop.
- Buspassescan now be purchased at all Walgreens (debit cardscan be used), Tax Collectorlocations, a few Winn- Dixie locations and a few Publix locationsfor $\$ 12$ for a weekly pass and \$40 for a monthly pass.
JTA's Community Shuttle Senvice - Four maps were handed out on the new shuttles: Northside, Broward Road, Mandarin, and New Cecil Community Shuttle. The maps had green shaded a reas that will be for the Deviation area. The shuttle buses are small 24 -passenger vans that can hold up to 5 wheel chairs. Each shuttle hasscheduled stops within its service area and can also be customized to meet your needs with advanced reservations. The shuttle connects with JTA's traditional bus service. Your options to ride the shuttle are:
- Board a J TA community shuttle at a designated stop at a scheduled time.
- You can reserve premium curbside service by calling 598-8724 at least 2 hours in advance or up to 3 calendardays before you ride.
- Limit camy-on items to no more than 3 grocery bags. (Operators are not allowed to assist passengers with camy-on items.)
- Be prepared to meet the shuttle early. The shuttle will not wait if you are not at the curbside location when the shuttle a mives
- Be near the curb orstop at least 5 minute prior to your a rranged pick-up.


## Fares:

- Regularfare is $\$ 1$ per ride - for info on fares/passes call 630-3100.
- A premium curbside service fee of $\$ .50$ will apply to each scheduled pick-up ordrop-off that is not at a designated stop. This premium fee is applicable to all fare categories including seniors, pass, or tic ket holders.
- Persons with disabilities travel at a reduced fare of $\$ .25$ per ride with a reduced fare card orvalid Medicare card.
- Seniors age 60 and older ride for free upon presentation of a govemment issued picture ID with birth date.

They will be printed in a week and the schedule goes into effect on Monday, Oct. 5. They also wanted to know how JTA was going to get the word out on the changes. ## Members Concems:

Member Vanderla an brought up the City Budget. There is a real crisis and the numbers are important. He proposed the following Motion which was seconded by Member Chance:

- Considering the current diffic ult city budget process, the Urban Core CPAC advises the City Council to adopt the Mayor's millage proposal. Residents of the Urban Core neighborhoods rely on many of the city services that may need to be cut if a dequate revenue is not provided. Discussion ensued. The numbers do not add up even with all the projected cuts. Services will also be cut. Member Chance discussed the millage rate and possible cuts aswell asJ EA going to charge a $\$ 2$ fee to pay the bills on line or in a JEA office starting in October. This will hurt people. The discussion continued and members did not want to come back next month to find the Neighborhood Coordinator Marilyn Fenton-Harmer's position cut. They would like Chairman Williams to rally the support of the other CPACS to unite usand attend the upcoming City Council meetings. It was also suggested to contact all the City Council Members at www.fixitnow.cc and let them know your position on the budget. The Vote: All in favor with one no vote.
Member Vanderlaan remarked that he hasdone a lot of research on the "Intemet cafes" which are unregulated gambling parlors that have no supervision or enforcement. He made the following Motion with a second by Member LaMounta in:
- The Urban Core CPAC urges the J acksonville City Council, Mayor, JSO and the State Attomey's office to work together to establish and enforce regulations on the small unregulated casinos know as "intemet cafes". Considering the known ha mful social effects of ga mbling, and the fact that Northeast Florida already offers dog racing and a state lottery, we advise that these "intemet cafes" should be closed. The J acksonville City Council to enact an ordinance to close the "intemet cafes". Disc ussion on the legality and JSO not being able to close them down. The conversation began last month when there were City Council members as guest speakers. Member Vanderlaan has spoken to an attomey that thought they could be regulated locally. The Allied Veterans of the World are the registered entity that operates some in J acksonville. Member Tippins would like to see them closed at once. Member Walker had a grocery receipt which advertised the one at $48^{\text {th }}$ Street and Main Street which is a cross the street from Northshore Elementary School. An Amendment was made by Member Vanderlaan with a second by Member Chance to change the last sentence to read: We advise the Jacksonville City Council to enact an ordinance to close the "intemet cafes". Motion reads as follows:
The Urban Core CPAC urges the Jacksonville City Council, Mayor, J SO and the State Attomey's office to work together to establish and enforce regulations on the small unregulated casinos know as "intemet cafes". Considering the known ha mful social effects of gambling, and the fact that Northeast Florida already offers dog racing and a state lottery, we advise the J acksonville City Council to enact an ordinance to close the "intemet cafes". The Vote: All in favor, none opposed.
