## Call to Order

Gamal Lyons, SE CPAC Chair, called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m.

#### **Speakers**

- Joel McEachin, Principal Planner Historic Preservation Planning and
  Development Department presented the development and planning history of
  the Southeast district. The pictorial presentation showed how the land was
  divided with the original Spanish land grants, how and where the first
  developments were established along the river, the boom of the 1920's and
  general growth and development that led to the construction of the Fuller
  Warren Bridge in 1954.
- Denise Ostertag AMIO Adult Services Division Marketing and Community Relations Recreation and Community Services Department informed the group of the various senior center locations and programs that are offered through the city. In the Southeast district there is one senior center: 3848 Hartley Road (in Mandarin) 262-7309. <u>Education - Chairman: George Banks.</u> No report. One of the CPAC members announced that the ground was broke for a new AAA high school in the 9A / Gate Parkway area. It was reported that construction should be completed by the 2010 graduating commencement. A number of CPAC members expressed their disappointment in regard to the lack of participation of the Duval County School Board members with the SE CPAC; this was discussed in length.

<u>Growth Management - Chairman: Frank Morgan</u>. Informed the group that at this time the Planning Department has not scheduled another Growth Management Visioning Community Meeting, but is optimistic that there will be a meeting soon. The final report/recommendations are scheduled to be completed by October or November. Also, legislation is being introduced that is geared to over ride Senate Bill 360 (SB 360). The new legislation would relax current building restrictions, thus compacting problems that exist with rapid development.
