Call to Order

Pat Corrado, Mandarin Community Club, called the meeting to order at 6:45 p.m.

Speaker

Chip Patterson, Chief, Emergency Preparedness Division Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department presented updates on various aspects of the 2006 Hurricane and Disaster Plan. Topics covered were: early preparedness, protecting your home, flood safety measures, evacuations, special needs evacuations/transportation, post storm challenges, power and water outages. Mr. Patterson also introduced the Citizens Emergency Response Team program. This is a national program that prepares people for emergency situations in their communities and neighborhoods, which is taught by the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department. Update on the infrastructure improvement in the Pine Forest heights area. Pine Forest Heights resident, Evette Murrell met with City council member Reggie Fullwood and JEA on May 24, 2006 in regard to the infrastructure problems. The streets are being resurfaced, but the water problems are the same. The new Pickwick Park's new passive park will be completed in phases. The first phase should be completed within a year at the cost of \$350,000. The first phase will include 10 exercise stations and a play ground for children ages 2-5.

Economic Development and Transportation – Chairperson: Bill Kintz / Mark Roesser. No Report

Education – Chairman: Paul Riel. Would like to request that the school board CPAC representative(s) attend CPAC meetings again.

Land Use & Zoning – Chairman: Jim Hill. Discuss the Avenues Walk 9 page Minor Modification (west side of Philips Hwy. between 9A & I-95). The proposed entrance will be an extension of Southside Boulevard.

Membership Recruitment – Chairman: Jim McKenney. This subcommittee attended the 2006 Mayor's Neighborhood Summit. Had the opportunity to meet new citizens and invite individuals to attend the SE CPAC meeting. Council member Art Shad has mailed out letters to all district 3 associations to assist in reaching new CPAC members.
