### 3. Staff Reports:

- Mayor's Representative Angela Spears announced:
  - Chair Kathy Budd and other CPAC Chairs met with Mayor Brown. Chair Budd expressed concerns regarding Westside issues. The Chairs discussed ways to find more members and get more people involved in CPAC.
  - o Mayor Brown joined others to announce a partnership to support the health of the St. Johns River.
  - o Mayor Brown is working on the Trailblazer awards.
  - o Mayor's Environmental Awards Luncheon is March 12 at the Jacksonville Zoo. Tickets are \$25.
  - o Mayor Brown's Senior Fish-A-Thon is March 18 at Hannah Park.

# • Jacksonville Sheriff's Office - Lt. Eason reported:

- o Break-ins at ice machines have created a crime trend in Zone 4.
- Thefts of appliances from homes under construction are continuing.
- o Suspects recently entered businesses through rooftops to avoid setting off door, glass or motion sensors.
- o Auto burglaries continued 80% of vehicles were unlocked.
- Several high-profile incidents have occurred in the past few weeks. With officers running from call to call, without enough time for community engagement.
- JSO was thanked for the tremendous amount of work in Cedar Hills Estates to close down a house of prostitution and a separate meth lab.
- o JSO was thanked for their work in Grand Park.

 As part of the 50 year celebration, FSCJ Cecil is partnering with the SW CPAC and other community organizations to host the 2015 Cecil Behind the Scenes Tour on May 28, 2015.

- Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Karen Taulbee reported:
  - o FDOT distributes reports electronically.
  - o Regional visioning forum Feb. 1, 8:30 a.m. 12:30 p.m. at the FDOT District 2 Urban Office Training Facility 2198 Edison Ave. The forum will provide input into the Florida Transportation Plan (FTP) and the Strategic Intermodal System (SIS) Policy Plan. The FTP defines Florida's future transportation vision and identifies goals, objectives, and strategies to accomplish that vision. The FTP is the statewide long-range transportation plan for all of Florida.
  - Public hearing on the I-10 and I-95 Interchange. Feb. 26, Open House 4:30 p.m., Presentation 6:30 p.m., at the Episcopal Church of the Good Shepherd, 1100 Stockton Street.
  - North Florida Transportation Planning Organization (NFTPO) co-hosts Alternative Fuel Vehicles (AFV) Expo on Feb. 19, 8:30 a.m. at University of North Florida. Included: highlight of fleet conversion successes, funding for alternative fuel vehicles/infrastructure, panel discussion, static display of LNG cars, electric cars and other vehicles.
  - Chair Budd thanked Ms. Taulbee for her report.
- Jacksonville Aviation Authority (JAA) Rusty Chandler reported:
  - Cecil airport is leasing former Navy buildings and has expanded 50%.
  - West Cecil Airport is completed leased.
  - East Cecil Airport will provide space for the Spaceport infrastructure is being planned. East Cecil Airport on the northern side, a new approach road will be constructed. 150 acres have been cleared for expansion. A taxi way is under construction.
  - o NAS Jax is closing runways to improve its runways, taxiways and airfield lighting. U.S. Navy planes will be moved to Cecil Airport about May through June. Included in the move will be fixed-wing operational equipment, P-8 planes and P-3 planes. The air traffic control tower will begin operating 24 hours a day, rather than closing at 10 p.m. but few noise complaints are expected because the P-8 and P-3 aircraft are quieter than FA-18s. Cecil only had two noise complaints last year. During the time the Navy planes are at Cecil, noise complaints will be segregated to identify noise from Cecil Airport or Navy planes. The Cecil-NAS agreement is for one year, with an option to extend the contract for six months.
  - May 28, 2015 JAA is co-sponsoring the 2015 Cecil Behind the Scenes Bus Tour. The tour will view the Flightstar hangar and other tenants at Cecil Airport and Cecil Commerce Center.
  - o Chair Budd thanked Mr. Chandler for his visit and for his report.
- Parks & Recreation Keith Meyerl reported:
  - Love Boone Park Day, tree planting and pruning event, Feb. 14, 9 a.m. noon. Meet by the St. Johns Van Wert playground.
  - o Parks is recruiting summer staff members: lifeguards, education facilitators, outdoor staff, etc.

- 4. Presentation: Vice Chair Abner Davis introduced the guest speaker, Dan Maloney, from the Jacksonville Zoo and Gardens, assisted by Erika Sepega. Both Mr. Maloney and Ms. Sepega are members of the AquaJax Advocacy Group, which proposes to place a world-class aquarium on the Northbank St. Johns Riverfront in the Shipyards area of downtown Jacksonville. AquaJax won first place in the Science Division at the 2014 One Spark Festival. The Jacksonville Zoo and Gardens board passed a resolution to endorse bringing an aquarium to Jacksonville with the Zoo managing the aquarium as zoos in other major cities manage their aquariums. The group proposes to link the aquarium and zoo via river taxis. The aquarium would provide an educational and entertaining alternative in the event inclement weather affects school field trips. Project commitments have been made by four major stakeholders. Currently money is being raised for a feasibility study. The first fund-raising event will be held Feb. 28, from 6-10 p.m. at the Jacksonville Landing. Chair Budd presented Mr. Maloney with a certificate of appreciation from the SW CPAC.
  - Len Burroughs made a motion to provide a letter of support for the AquaJax project. Tom Martin seconded the motion. All were in favor.
- **5.** Chair's Report: Chair Kathy Budd reported:
  - CPAC Chairs met with Mayor Brown. The Chairs are expecting follow-up to questions and concerns.
  - Concerns the Westside will be negatively affected by the Planning Commission's approval of Limes Billiards and a liquor store despite the CPAC's and neighborhoods' objections.
  - Concerns about the negative impact on Westside neighborhoods by Ability Housing apartments.

## 6. Elected Officials' Reports:

- Council Member Doyle Carter, a SW CPAC Charter Member, reported:
  - o JEA was commended for doing a great job at Jacksonville International Airport and at Cecil Airport.
  - He attended a meeting with Hillwood in Texas.
  - o Flightstar has 1100 employees.
  - o Jacksonville Equestrian Center has over 1000 contestants.
  - o The annual RV show is Feb. 26- Mar. 1 at the Jacksonville Equestrian Center (JEC). The RV show is the largest show hosted by JEC.
  - Cecil Recreation Center hosted umpire training in January.
  - o The I-10 Marietta Interchange is on schedule.
  - o His office has received reports of automobiles speeding in subdivisions. JSO was contacted.
  - o Chair Budd thanked Council Member Carter for his report.
- Council Member Jim Love reported:
  - o The Love Boone Park clean-up is Saturday, Feb. 14, 9 a.m. noon.
  - Costco is moving forward with plans to build at Collins Road and I-295.
  - o Super Walmart at Collins Road and I-295 is breaking ground.
  - He has been serving on the Blight Committee. The committee is making progress cleaning up the city.
    - •JSO purchased cameras to address ongoing illegal dumping (blight) issues. Camera installation has begun.
    - A second snipe sign and tire buy-back event is scheduled for March 28, 2015.
    - The Blight Committee addressed bus routes and bus stops. Some routes have remained unchanged for years. Some bus stops created blight and others opportunities for crime. JTA has changed bus routes and stops. "Next bus features" provide real time bus information <a href="https://www.nextbus.com">www.nextbus.com</a>. Trash cans were added to bus stops where blight was a problem.
  - o General Electric, at the Cecil Commerce Center, created new, good-paying jobs.
  - o Pension discussions are continuing.
  - o Exciting things are happening in Jacksonville dream big!
  - o Chair Budd thanked Council Member Love for his report.

- Membership and Public Relations: Abner Davis asked members to bring a guest to the March meeting.
- He has not yet had a reply from James Croft about what the CPAC is allowed to do regarding public relations, such as promotion via internet and social media sites.
  - Transportation- Tom Martin reported the following items were discussed at the Feb. 4 North Florida Transportation Organization (TPO) meeting:
  - A new member was received and a committee was established to discuss bylaws.
  - Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) installation on State Road 16 in St. Johns County.
  - Update on Butler Boulevard and State Road 9B projects in the environmental phase.
  - JTA's request to discuss ferry and bus rapid transit phase 2.
  - Presentation about the I-95 and Airport Road Access Management Concepts. Feb. 16, 2015 public hearing at Hilton Garden Inn, 4:30 p.m. open house/6:30 p.m. presentation.
  - Mr. Martin expressed a concern about the lack of transportation infrastructure. Jacksonville needs a rapid transit system. A brief discussion was held regarding transportation.
  - The next TPO meeting is March 9, 2015
- o ShAdCo Alice Turknett's absence was excused. Linda Barrow announced the first ShAdCo Zone 4 Safety Fair was held on Jan. 17. The weather was good and the turnout excellent. In the future, to efficiently use resources, 3 zones will join for one safety fair. The next safety fair is April 18, 2015 at Regence Square, ShAdCo 2. Chair Budd thanked Ms. Barrow for volunteering at the ShAdCo Safety Fair.
- o Cecil Area Bruce Tyson reported that Rusty Chandler had provided updates on the Cecil area.
- o Governmental Affairs Gina Bradley reported the subcommittee met to discuss how the Governmental Affairs/Economic Development Subcommittee can be improved- staff support and the committee members' better understanding of the process are needed.
- o Taxation, Revenue & Utilization of Expenditures (TRUE) Commission Abner Davis reported:
  - TRUE met Thursday, Feb. 5. The following items were discussed: the Northwest Jacksonville Economic Development Fund, pension reform, JSO budget and JSO positions.

- A member expressed a concern about the roadway project on Roosevelt Boulevard between Roosevelt Boulevard Bridge and Timuquana Avenue. Workers are littering the area with personal trash. Tubes and sandbags also litter the area. She has contacted FDOT, but the issue remains unresolved. Karen Taulbee said she will ask FDOT to follow up with the contractor.
- The Westside Business Leaders Association will host a candidate forum on Feb. 12, noon.
