Call to Order/Verify Quorum

Chair Bruce Tyson called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m.. A quorum was verified by Mary Beth Ridderman, Coordinator, Community Development, Housing and Neighborhoods.

Approval of the Meeting Summary:

Chair Tyson asked for approval of the August summary. A motion was made and seconded to accept the summary. The vote: all in favor.

JSO Report: Lt. R. A. Norse reported an overall decrease in crime during the past 30 days with a slight increase in the number of smash and grab incidents, primarily victimizing Family Dollar Stores. Chair Tyson thanked Lt. Norse for his report.

<u>Introductions and Acknowledgments</u>. Chair Tyson recognized the following guests: former CPAC member Valerie Bethea, UNF Nursing Student, Rachelle Parman and Ortega Bluffs resident, Jill Dame and said he was pleased to see them at the CPAC

meeting. Chair Tyson acknowledged former City Council Member Alberta Hipps and introduced the guest speaker, City Council Member John Crescembini.

<u>Guest Speaker</u>: City Council Member John Crescembini reported on the budget process and explained the City Council's plan and position. He discussed his interest in a tangible personal property tax which lists and taxes all assets in businesses at market value. A question, comment and answer session followed with residents asking questions and expressing their concerns about the following topics: proposed cuts to JSO budget, reduction in officers and impact on crime rate; proposed budget cuts, union contracts, pension plans and the negotiation process; cost of indigent care at Shands Hospital; raising millage or spending the contingency fund; proposed cuts to senior programs and to the Veteran's Day Parade.
