Call to Order/Quorum:

Chair Ralph Malphurs called the meeting to order. At 7:04 p.m.. A quorum was verified by Mary Beth Ridderman.

Approval of the Meeting Summary:

Chair Malphurs asked for approval of the February and March SW CPAC summary. A motion to accept the summary was made and seconded. The vote: all in favor. None opposed.

Introductions/Acknowledgements:

Chair Malphurs acknowledged JSO Assistant Chief Tom Hackney, Lt. T.C. Davis and Sgt. Ed Howard and thanked them for their regular attendance at CPAC meetings and expressed appreciation from the CPAC for JSO's informative reports.

JSO Report: Asst' Chief Hackney reported that the numbers of crimes are up related to cars, due to residents leaving pursed, bags, wallets, c.d.s, phones, laptops and other valuables in plain sight in their cars. Overall, numbers of crimes are down since January but violent crimes are up 13%. He suggested residents carefully screen news stations because stations often report on newsworthy crimes from other cities. Overall, Jacksonville is 50% safer now than 15 years ago. Chair Malphurs thanked Chief Hackney for his report and for JSO's on-going good work in the community. The number for the Zone 4 Substation is 573-3165.

Presentation:

Prentis Clayton, Commuter Services Program Manager, First Coast Metropolitan Planning Organization (FCMPO) provided handouts and presented information regarding available commuter services including van pooling and car pooling. Mr. Clayton explained FCMPO, offers a program that will assist in the lease and insurance for a vans for van-pooling. The vans are funded by Florida Department of Transportation. They can also assist with obtaining reduced insurance rates for residents who car pool. For more information, call 306-7513.
