Staff Reports

- Mayor's Liaison Devin Reed, Director of Procurement reported that the Mayor will be presenting the upcoming budget at City Hall tomorrow and everyone is invited. Highlands Branch Library opened last week and the Maxville Branch will open this weekend. Questions were asked about the Town Centers. The Paxon/Biltmore and Pickettville communities asked for assistance on the amount of inmates that will be coming to a new halfway house. There currently is one halfway house for 41 inmates and the new one will hold 100 inmates. This is all within 1 mile of 4 schools. A Motion was made to write a letter on behalf of the neighborhood but with a lack of information members tabled this discussion. - Planning & Development Lara Diettrich reported that the Consolidated Plan issued a notice and the draft is on the web for the next 5 years regarding all programs for CDBG (Community Development Block Grants). It is a very long document. There will be time for public input on July 26th at the Florida Theatre Building, 6th floor and on August 12th for questions and the final draft on August 16th. Lara met with Erma Cole, Rev. Mobely, Diane Kerr and Councilman Fullwood on the Crush Crete Plant in Robinson's Addition. The neighbors are having major concerns on the dust and noise. - Neighborhoods Department:
 - O Property Safety/Code Enforcement Supervisor Del Miley reported that there will be 25 releases for demolitions. On the 700 block of Smart Avenue they did a DART on a house and the neighbors are very happy. The resident had been evicted in March but never left and there has not been any water or electricity for a year. Cleaned up and secured the crack house on Crystal Springs Road. Continue to do a lot of work with the police and with the amount of rain there have been lots of citations for yards not being mowed. They can be reached at 391-3600.

Member Barney Roberts brought up the issue of the city right-of-way not being mowed. He asked for a Motion for the NW CPAC to write a letter asking the Public Works Department to put them on a schedule and follow up with contractors to be sure they are doing the job they are paid for. A second was made by Elaine Burnett. The Vote: All in favor, none opposed. Member Rev. Anthony Wyche was concerned with our tax dollars and how they are being spent.
