### **Guest Speaker**

# • Jarik Conrad, Blueprint for Prosperity

At the request of the chair, Joyce Hellmann Bizot, Senior Planner, Neighborhood Services Division introduced the speaker, Jarik Conrad, Executive Director of Blueprint for Prosperity.

Jarik gave his appeal to CPAC members and guests to participate in community groups and focus meetings in locations all over the city in a project that seeks to close the gap on declining income in Jacksonville. Blueprint for Prosperity is seeking buy-in from wide and diverse audiences for this citywide effort, sponsored through a partnership between the City of Jacksonville and the Jacksonville Regional Chamber of Commerce to raise the city's median income.

Jarik explained that community meetings will be held all over town and media outlets are being contacted extensively to help get the word out on the project. Members questioned whether the Blueprint for Prosperity would work and if so how. They noted that plans are in place for the town center projects and funding is needed to make dreams come true. The chair said that development of the NW area continues to lack sufficient businesses and services to support the families who live in there. Jarik stated that being from East St. Louis, Illinois, he is very familiar with areas that face economic hardship and the work that is required to bring about change. He invited those interested to call his assistant Michelle Pritchard at 924-1100, ext. 250 to sign up. He also suggested that for an in-depth look at how the process will work, Henry Luke's website, <a href="www.lukevision.com">www.lukevision.com</a>. Henry Luke is the person who has defined the project and put community visioning into practice in numerous other communities.
