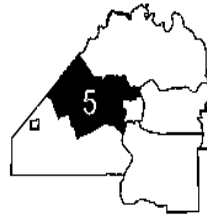

Staff Reports

JSO – Zone 5 Sgt. Cannon reported on the following:

- For the month of February violent crime in Zone 5 is down 39%, property crime is down 35% and overall crime is down 36%.
- In Sherwood Forest black males have been hiding in bushes and waiting for homeowners to arrive home and take their wallets and purses and in a few cases took cars as well.
- At clubs like the VFW Post, Moncrief and others ladies have been leaving their purses locked in the trunk or covered on the seat of the car only to come out later and find the purse gone from the car. Please be mindful of your surroundings. If you have to leave something valuable in your car lock it up before you get to your destination. You don't know if you are being watched.

Members asked if a person is attacked do you have the right to defend your self. In the past few years the law has changed in Florida. You do have the right to defend yourself or your loved ones. That being said use prudent judgment. It is best to begin by yelling and screaming. You can also throw your purse or wallet on the ground. Chairperson Kelly stated the Public Defender Matt Shirk had to reschedule to the April meeting. He sent his apologies.

2010 Census - Roslyn Phillips, Chief Community Officer, Director of Recreation and Community Services and tonight for the 2010 Census. The Census has been around since 1790 under Thomas Jefferson. Every ten years we are required by law to be counted. Originally the numbers were used to determine the number of seats for the House of Representatives. Today city governments use the numbers for planning, transportation and trends as well as the funds that are distributed to the states. The country disperses \$400 billion dollars and Jacksonville receives \$100 million dollars as a result of the 2000 Census numbers for various services.

On April 1st everyone needs to have filled in the Census form and have mailed it back. The form should arrive next week. The slogan is “10,10,10” Ten minutes for 10 questions in 2010. The questions will be: name, address, education, ethnicity and who lives in the home. The Census workers have taken an oath of privacy and will not share this information with anyone. Everyone is to be counted. April 1st is the day the workers will start knocking on doors. They will come back up to 9 times. We have only one chance to be counted every ten years. In the 2000 Census the National average for returns was 75% in Jacksonville it was 66%. Please fill in your form and return it as soon as it arrives. Scams have already surfaced asking for \$10 to be returned with the form. Do not send any money. Let your neighbors know how important it is to fill out the Census 2010 form is.

Staff Reports

Mayor's Representative Devin Reed reported on the following:

- The budget season is starting earlier and earlier every year. This year was a very difficult year. There are certain things being considered such as Pension Reform. This is not sustainable. When the Mayor took office it was \$40 million dollars and the obligation this year is \$110 million and it continues to escalate. Other areas they are looking at are the current staffing, 3% pay reduction across the board and may have to reduce services and staff.
- The Mayor is holding Budget Workshops and you may want to participate in what should be in the upcoming budget. It was mentioned that Clanzel Brown Center is under construction and my have to move locations. Neighborhood Coordinator will pass along the word along if changes. ([The meeting for District 5 on March 25 will now be at Ribault High School.](#))
- Some people may question why the City continues to work on the Downtown landscape with the budget shortfalls. The money being used on the Courthouse and other Downtown projects is with capital improvement money and this cannot be used for operating expenses. The Courthouse is coming along nicely and this may be one of the best times to actually be constructing anything since the market prices are relatively low.

Members had questions on the following: If someone retires and are receiving a pension can they come back to work for the city and still get their pension. Chairperson Kelly encouraged everyone to sign up for the budget workshops. Members will be better informed on the process. It was stated the City Council Members are looking for citizens to participate in the process. They will also be having Budget Workshops. Don't sit on your rights. Know where you fit in on this process.

Chairperson Kelly also wanted to echo what Ms. Phillips said on the Census and fill it out as soon as you receive it and send it in. This brings money back to the city.

Mayor's Office – Project New Ground – Carita Parks reported on the following:

- They have been working in the Brown's Dump area the past few months.
- Last week they launched the 5th and Cleveland Street remediation.
- They will then move on to Emmett Reed Park before the Summer Camp begins. The residential portion will follow after the Park has been completed.
- In May or June they will begin in the Forest Street and Lonnie Miller Park sites.
- Jacksonville was selected by the EPA to host a Superfund Job Training for construction sites. There are three types of jobs: ground crew, heavy equipment and dump truck operators. The information meeting is mandatory on Tuesday, March 16 or Wednesday March 17. To sign up go to www.jaxsuperjti.com or call 448-3492. Once the training is complete the person will have earned two different licenses and certifications. Flyers were passed out.

FDOT - Milton Locklear had no report but announced some good news. Due to the economy FDOT did receive money in the 2nd round of stimulus funds and the project on Cahoon Road in the NW Planning District will be resurfaced from these funds. Planning & Development – NW Planner Susan Cohn reported on the following:

The City of Jacksonville's Future Land Use Element (FLUE) is a document that illustrates the location and distribution of land uses (residential, commercial, industrial, etc.) throughout the city. The element and its associated map, the Future Land Use Map, are part of the City of Jacksonville's 2010 Comprehensive Plan, adopted in 1990 as a requirement of State law (Chapter 163.3177(13-14), Florida Statutes). The 2010 Comprehensive Plan, including the Future Land Use Element, is tasked with guiding the growth and development of Jacksonville until 2010. Local governments are required by State law to assess the effectiveness of their Comprehensive Plans every seven years. This assessment is called the Evaluation and Appraisal Report (EAR). In the past nine years, the City of Jacksonville has received 2000 requested amendments to the Future Land Use Map. The City's Future Land Use Map has become largely ineffective in guiding the growth and development of Jacksonville.

- This is an update on the Future Land Use Map and Element (FLUM & FLUE). The EAR (Evaluation and Appraisal Report) recommendations to update the 2010 Comprehensive Plan to 2030 Plan have been adopted by the city and became effective on February 8th.
- The FLUM & FLUE have gone to City Council for the first round of hearings but there is still time to have a presentation for your community. There will be another round of public hearings in June.

NW CPAC Land Use & Zoning Subcommittee – Member Solomon reported on the following:

1. 2009-C-016 Land Use and 2010-257 Rezoning at 8446 Devoe Street near Cahoon Road. It is currently LDR and RLD-60 and proposing CGC (land use and CCG-1 (zoning). It will come up in May and currently there are no recommendations. The LUZ Subcommittee votes to approve this change.

A Motion to approve this change was made by Member Wyche and a second by Member Burgess. The Vote: All in favor; none opposed.

2. 2009C-021 Land Use and 2010-263 Rezoning at West Stockton Street on the south side of McCoy's Creek Blvd. This will come up in May and currently there are no recommendations. Chairperson Kelly asked if the neighborhood association had a recommendation. The neighborhood had not been notified. Chairperson Kelly asked the newly formed LUZ Subcommittee to bring recommendations before the entire group that had recommendations from the neighborhood and Planning Department. We do not want to get ahead of ourselves. This was referred back to the LUZ Subcommittee.

- The property at 5720 Geranium has hedges that are extremely high. This was brought up last month and at the time was not cited but Code would go back and check this property.
- At Lake Forest Blvd off Lem Turner there is a white and red house that has been condemned. It was stated that it is a fire boarded up home and is on the track for demolition if it is not repaired. It has been like this for about a year and it is an eye sore for the neighborhood. They will check on the status of this property.
