# **Guest Speakers**

Recreation Planning and Grants Coordinator Daryl Joseph gave a PowerPoint presentation on the "Ribault River Preserve". In the future they will be bringing new initiatives forward to get feedback. The Preserve will not be an eye sore for the neighborhood but a benefit to the community. They have asked JSO to monitor the park. They will eventually add a walking trail and a fishing pier but not a boat dock. Members had numerous questions in particular whom or when will the Ribault River near U.S. 1 will be cleaned up. Members do not want to see the preserve land on Clyde Drive developed into a park. They want to have it sold to developers for single family housing. JTA – Fred Haley, Mike Miller and Endya Cummings attended the meeting and gave a PowerPoint presentation on the upcoming Riverside Trolley Service starting May 5. They are hoping this will help reduce traffic congestion and parking issues and connect downtown workers with other lunch time restaurants. There is an FDOT grant to fund this for 2 years for \$190,000. The cost will be 50 cents each way and will be available from 10 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. coming by every 10 minutes. A weekly pass is available and it will be free for seniors. The new service will be free the first two weeks from May 5 to May 16. <u>Municipal Code Compliance</u> Code Compliance Zone 5 Supervisor Maria Buchwalter introduced Senior Officer Mike Waelde. They are continuing to do systematic inspections and have just begun them in North Riverside and Mixon Town. If you have concerns please call 630-CITY. The time frame has been improving and they are hiring 4 new officers and Zone 5 is hoping to get 2 of them. At the last inspection in the neighborhood from McDuff to King St. to Beaver to 1-10 they had 8 officers with 53 nuisances, 26 junk cars, 84 violations and 31 cars tagged. The Special Masters Board continues to meet and they heard 33 cases.

#### Chairman Burgess's Report

- Chairman Burgess introduced Rick McCain from Tetra Tec, a local environmental company that will be applying to clean up the ash sites and will come to next months meeting to go over what their company provides.
- Chairman Burgess introduced Professor Ahrens and the UNF Nursing Students and thanked them for attending. Currently the nurses are working with Cleveland Arms on helping them with a vegetable garden for better nutrition. They continue to work with the City Rescue Mission and are looking into the infant mortality rate.

#### **Announcements/Public Comments**

 Member Danny Thomas talked about trying to get the Mayor to come to a ShAdCo meeting. It was suggested to write a letter but ShAdCo is for crime and to contact Sheriff

- Rutherford. At the ShAdCo meeting the Sheriff needs 225 more officers but with a \$30 million dollar cut from the State there is a tug of war with the money.
- Members expressed concern that the Jacksonville Journey didn't have neighborhood people on the committee. That is not true said Member Peele and Member Kerr is also on the committee.
- Member Burnett had taped the NW CPAC bus tour and gave a copy to sponsor Member Wyche and if anyone wants a copy to see her.
- Guest Frank Brendon from the Paxon/Biltmore neighborhood has been working on a petition to get the city to change the street lights from the high pressure sodium 70 watts that break down after 7 to 9 months to a bright white light. He is suggesting that if every one that received a JEA bill would pay an extra \$5 a month for six months that would be \$21 million dollars and they could be replaced. The new bright white light bulbs last approximately 24.9 years and would also save on replacement costs. He would like to get as many people to sign the petition and then present it to the City Council.
- Guest Brendon would also like to see the city start a program similar to one in Connecticut to replace senior citizens bulbs to help save on utilities and help prevent falls with better lighting.
- Guest Ms. Cowart who came before the NW CPAC meeting in January with Zoning Application 2007 C-044 would like to thank Chairman Burgess, Ms. Harmer and the CPAC committee for the Jan. meeting amendment application with the discussion and motion about the Ribault Park Preserve. On Jan. 12 she met with Ms. Yates who assured her that it will be positive preserve with no loud music or crime and she withdrew her opposition. She once again thanked the CPAC.
- Member Muldrow does not want to see the preserve land on Clyde Drive developed into a park. They want to have it sold to developers for single family housing.
- Member Muldrow is a member of the Northside Civic Association which is an umbrella organization since 1988. With all the new industries that will be coming to JaxPort there is no infrastructure such as roads for all the trucks that will be needed on Hecksher Drive. They are projecting 1400 more 18 wheelers to go back and forth on Hecksher Drive to Jaxport/Blount Island and the roadway is not there to support the increased numbers. They are trying to get a petition started on this with more information on this to come.
- Member Myrick has concerns on the corner of Division and 21st Street with loitering and it will get worse as the weather gets warmer.
