- Regulatory Compliance Municipal Code Compliance Division Tim Myers reported:
 - o Zone 6 officers completed 2,189 inspections in the past month. City wide, officers conducted 12,583 inspections.
 - Last month a request was made for the number of buildings demolished in Zone 6. Mr. Myers reported: since Oct. 1, 2015, 76 properties were written up. Last year, 244 were written up and 32 were demolished. In addition, a house at Dunn Avenue near Wingate was demolished by the owner, after being cited with the new ordinance 2014-427 (Any non-historic, blighted, vacant, unoccupied building or is occupied by transient persons, that has been boarded up, has unpaid code enforcement, nuisance or demolition liens, and has no active water or electric service for a time period that exceeds 24 months.).
