- 1. The meeting was called to order at 4:02 p.m. by Chair Bobby Taylor.
- 2. A quorum was verified by Mary Beth Ridderman, Coordinator, Housing and Neighborhoods Department.
- 3. Guest Speaker City Council Member Ray Holt discussed updates in District 11, the City's settlement with Waste Management, the budget, increased city fees and ordinance 2010-327, which will require registration of foreclosed properties
- 4. Presentation Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), presented by Wanda Forrest. Projects planned for the North District include: Heckscher Drive resurfacing Heckscher Drive Shad creek Bridge replacement, Heckscher Drive Brown/Clapboard Creek bridge Rehab/Repair, Dames Point Bridge Rehabilitation, Main Street resurfacing, Main Street/Trout River Bridge resurfacing and fender work, SR 9A from I-95 to Dames Point Bridge add lane and reconstruct, SR 9A from Atlantic Blvd. to I-95 North and others. - 7. Chair's Report: Chair Taylor inquired if members want a presentation to learn more about the pros and cons of Hometown Democracy. The Chair inquired if a presentation is wanted to learn more about the Cecil Commerce Center and Hillwood as a master developer. Members voted to invite speakers from both sides of the issue.

- A. JSO Assistant Chief Michael Rutledge announced:
  - The main problem is burglaries occurring from 7 a.m. and lasting until

    at work. Suspects have been arrested in a burglary to a business/pizza
    place.

  - Sheriff's Neighborhood Crime Prevention Zone 6 Walk will be held on Monday, May 25 at 5:30 p.m.. The walk will begin at the intersection of Ross Boulevard and Frances Avenue. He asked all CPAC, ShAdCo Members and guests participate.

## C. City Council Member's Reports -

- Council Member Ray Holt discussed Ordinance 2010-326 regarding internet cafes. He said his business office is located near the internet café on 1403 Dunn Avenue. Council Member Holt said he has personally observed a number of criminal activities, for example, drug deals, prostitutes offering for business, and other criminal activities. Council Member Holt said the internet café is close to the Dairy Queen. The Dairy Queen manager asserts that the internet café runs off his business on Wednesday and Saturday evenings. Council Member Holt cosponsored ordinance 2010-326.
- **D. Duval County School Board –** Vicki Drake announced the School Board is working on the budget.

- **G.** Municipal Code Compliance Officer Buchwalter reported:
  - Municipal Code Enforcement Officers conducted a systematic inspection Lake Forest and Panama Park areas.
  - During summer months, officers will focus on overgrown grass/weeds.
  - Council Member Holt added that the Pink Palace is about to be demolished.

- I. Recreation and Community Nathan Rezeau reported:

  - A concern was expressed regarding the proposed restaurant at the Palms Fish Camp. Mr. Rezeau reported the city issued a default letter and asked for a construction completion date which was not met. A termination letter will be sent on May 10.
  - A concern was expressed regarding a safety issue related to traffic congestion caused by cars in line to pay fees for entrance into Huguenot Park. Mr. Rezeau said they are looking at options.

- **D.** Taxation Revenue Expenditures (TRUE) Commission Representative: Hiron Peck announced:
  - The TRUE Commission found that COJ operating departments do not have specific contacts. For example, no one was supervising indigent care.
  - He had questions about city services because he his call to 630-CITY did not get a good response. Dr. Peck obtained a form that may be used to report and track reports to 630CITY (2489). He asked members to fax in the report form and keep a copy for follow up at the next CPAC meeting. The form was distributed and Chair Taylor asked Ms. Ridderman to distribute the form electronically.

### 10. New Business:

 Nancy Landau asked the Governmental Affairs Subcommittee to follow the proposed ordinance 2010-327. She strongly encouraged residents to check into their homeowners' associations and how many have received notices of foreclosures. She expressed concern about the number of abandoned homes in neighborhoods. She said 2010-327 is an opportunity for more notice to the homeowners associations when a property is in foreclosure.
