- 1. The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by Chair Mike Getchell. Chair Getchell reminded everyone to sign in and place cell phones in silent mode.
- 2. A quorum was verified by Mary Beth Ridderman, Coordinator, Housing and Neighborhoods Department.
- **3. Presentation** Transportation Improvement Plan, by Milton Locklear, N. FL Transportation Planning Organization. The N. FL Transportation Planning Organization

(TPO) is the regional transportation planning agency for Duval and most of Clay, Nassau and St. Johns Counties, covering over 1000 square miles and 1.2 million residents. Their mission to provide a regional forum for developing an effective transportation system that moves people and goods safely, economically, and efficiently maintaining a high quality of life in Northeast Florida. They provide transportation planning, technical analysis, communications and finance. Funding is from federal and state grants, member municipalities and transportation agencies. The Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) is a 5 year, \$2billion plan for all 3 counties. Projects in the North District include: Resurfacing Dunn Avenue from US 1 to I-295; Resurfacing Busch Drive from I-95 to US 17; Preliminary engineering study for painting Sisters Creek Bridge; Ongoing maintenance to Clapboard Creek Bridge and others. - 4. Summary of the previous meeting was approved.
- 5. Old Business none.
- 6. Chair's Report:
 - Council Member Webb asked the Jacksonville Waterways Commission for input on the issue of salt water mitigation at Piney Island. Council Member Crescimbeni asked to defer the issue until the committee receives more information. A discussion followed.

7. Staff Reports

- A. JSO Assistant Chief T.C. Davis reported:
 - - Every Wednesday from 9 -12 all Zone Commanders and Commanders of Detective Units meet to discuss crime.
 - Two unusual crimes occurred: one involving two suspects at the Mirage Show Bar – a different zone – in possession of an AK47/SKS weapon. Both suspects were caught and confessed to two armed robberies. A second crime involved a smash and grab business burglary. Later in the same evening an officer in another zone stopped someone for speeding and found the suspects were still wearing camouflage clothing, fake hair, masks were in possession of the cash register taken from the business. The suspects confessed to crimes in Nassau and St. Johns counties and were charged with over 30 felonies.
 - He is proud of Zone 6 JSO Officers. Today a JSO Officer observed and stopped a pick up truck carrying a large air conditioning unit. The driver was recently released from prison after serving time for armed robbery and attempted murder. The driver provided JSO with the names of a ring of people stealing air conditioners.
 - Officers took a case with no leads involving incidents along I-295 in Zones 2 and 4 (Normandy Blvd). The same suspects were involved in Arlington, Northside and the Westside. JSO successfully cleared the case.
 - Crime is down by 6.79 percent. Murder and traffic homicide are down. The goal is down by 3 percent.

- B. Mayor's Representative Mike Sweat announced:
 - The Mayor's Office is working on the budget.
 - The State budget passed.

- The State made cuts to State colleges, private colleges and the school system.
- He spent the morning with a State Representative and encouraged the CPAC to invite a State Representative to provide a report.
- The Extension Office hosted a visioning session. Other offices across the state participated in the visioning.
- He asked residents to search Google for the Extension Office website (http://duval.ifas.ufl.edu/) and participate in the survey.

- C. City Council Member's Reports No representative. No report.
- D. Duval County School Board No representative. No report.
- E. Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Thomas Hill reported:
 - On Thursday, May 12, the Sister's Creek Bridge will close for a project final inspection.
 - The shear locks are being replaced on the Dames Point Bridge. To meet signage requirements, lanes will be closed down beyond the bridge. Barrels are transgressing into thru lanes from construction lanes.
 - On June 2, 4:30 at the Hampton Inn, a public meeting will be held to discuss the use of discretionary funding to facilitate access to the National Cemetery. Public Comments begin at 6:30 p.m.
 - An issue was raised at a previous CPAC meeting regarding barriers blocking driver's vision at the 9-A southbound exit ramp to Heckscher Drive. FDOT is aware of the problem but they cannot do anything about it, since the barrier protects the bridge.
 - Dunn Avenue and I-95 Eastbound lanes will be improved with striping.
 - The Sister's Creek Bridge project is being completed.
 - The Dames Point Bridge project is under construction
 - The Clapboard Creek Bridge project is beginning soon to repair the substructure. The project is estimated to be completed within 240 days.
 - FDOT determined the intersection at Palm Bluff and Heckscher Drive does not offer sufficient conflict to warrant a sign warning motorists about an upcoming intersection. Gerie Leigh expressed concern about the danger of people turning left when other drivers attempt to pass. FDOT said it is a traffic enforcement issue.
 - A discussion followed regarding the Dames Point Bridge. A concern was expressed about insufficient notice/signage/barrels to indicate lane closures at the bridge. Mr. Hill said he will contact the contractor.

F. Municipal Code Compliance – Bruce Chauncey reported:

- The Old Flower Shop at 6305 Pearl Street is now a vacant lot.
- A systematic inspection was completed at Riverview.
- Please report suspected code violations to 630-CITY (630-2489).
- G. Planning and Development Amy Hays reported:
 - State and local funding is being cut.
 - Her own job, along with 7 others were eliminated. Twelve other employees were demoted. Her department was one of the first to announce Reduction in Force, but other departments will announce staff cuts. In 2012, residents can expect even more cuts to COJ staff due to the budget deficits. She was unsure which staff person will attend the CPAC meetings. Chair Getchell said he was sorry to hear that Amy's job had been cut because she has been a benefit to the CPAC.

 - Dick Berry announced Council Member E. Denise Lee is the chair of the redistricting/Rules Committee. According to the 2010 Census, Duval County's total population is 864,263 (62000 persons per district). The voting age population total is 660,749 (47000 per district). Planning District 6 increased by 55 percent. The SE CPAC requested Council Member Lee present a preview of the redistricting plan. Mr. Berry made a motion to write a letter to Council Member Lee and explain the CPAC is interested in seeing a preview of the plan and would like to be included in any meetings with other CPACs. The motion was seconded by Harry Wagner and a discussion followed. The motion was amended by Gerie Leigh to ask Council Member E. Denise Lee to present a preview of redistricting. A second on the amendment was made by Rex Neidlinger. A discussion was held on the amended motion. The vote: 8 in favor, 3 opposed.
 - Harry Wagner announced several dangerous traffic problems exist in the • North District. He discussed the need for a letter to Public Works.
 - o There is no traffic light at the intersection of Gillespie Road and Airport Center Drive and it is dangerous. Several accidents have already occurred. A traffic study needs to be requested for a light.
 - Safety issue at Starratt Road and Dunns Creek Road where 5 lanes merge.. This is a dangerous intersection and visibility is a problem. The AT& T box needs to be moved to improve safety.

9. Public Comments:

- Tony Bates announced he is a past member of the SW CPAC. He is a member of Concerned Taxpayers. He asked for support for the list of candidates on their website. He said he will provide handouts after the meeting and he announced the information will be printed in the Times Union.
