She reported that in 2008, 1200 trucks per day will be arriving and departing the port but no plans are in place to widen the road or to facilitate ingress and egress of the trucks. A question was raised and Dot Mathias replied that within a few years, in addition to the 1200 trucks, another 8500 trucks per day will be using Hecksher Drive.

He answered questions about the canning facility and explained that the City Council voted to fund limited operation of the center by volunteers. Volunteers are in the process of being certified and they hope to open in January on a limited basis.
