1. DISABILITY RETIREMENT APPLICATION

<u>COLVIN, Stephen T.</u>, Firefighter, 11 yrs. of service, currently on temporary disability, applying for disability retirement.

JOHN KEANE STATED THAT AN APPLICATION FOR DISABILITY PENSION WAS SUBMITTED AND FORWARDED TO DR. BAKER FOR REVIEW. THE LETTER FROM DR. BAKER IS BEING PRESENTED TO THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE TODAY.

STEPHEN COLVIN IS HERE ALONG WITH HIS ATTORNEY WILLIAM SHEPPARD WHO WOULD LIKE TO SPEAK TO THE COMMITTEE MEMBERS ON BEHALF OF HIS CLIENT.

ATTORNEY SHEPPARD THANKED THE COMMITTEE FOR PROVIDING COLVIN WITH TEMPORARY DISABILITY WHILE HIS CASE IS BEING REVIEWED. HE WAS A FIREFIGHTER FOR OVER 10 YEARS. HE HAS MEDICAL ISSUES HE IS DEALING WITH. THE CITY SAYS THEY HAVE NO JOB FOR HIM. THERE IS A JOB!

ON SEPTEMBER 8, 2014, ATTORNEY SHEPPARD SENT A LETTER TO THE CITY WHICH HE READ TO THE COMMITTEE. THE CITY HAS UNTIL NEXT WEEK TO RESPOND. THE CITY PAID FOR THE PHYSICIANS THAT EXAMINED COLVIN. STEPHEN WORKED IN QUALITY CONTROL UNDER THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT AND REHABILITATION ACT. STEPHEN CAN CONTRIBUTE. IF HE CAN'T WORK, THEN IT'S HIS DISABILITY.

ATTORNEY SHEPPARD ASKED THE BOARD TO DEFER THEIR ACTION UNTIL THE CITY RESPONDS TO THE SEPTEMBER 8TH LETTER.

JOHN RECOMMENDED TO THE COMMITTEE THAT THEY DEFER THEIR ACTION FOR 90 DAYS AND CONTINUE TO PAY COLVIN THE TEMPORARY DISABILITY.

MOTION WAS MADE BY ELLIS BURNS TO CONTINUE THE TEMPORARY DISABILITY AND DEFER ACTION FOR 90 DAYS ON THE APPROVAL OR DENIAL OF A DISABILITY PENSION. SECONDED BY BRADY RIGDON. UNANIMOUS.
